Sample methodology

- On behalf of Climate Policy & Strategy Associates, YouGov Blue fielded the December 2025 wave of the UK Climate Tracker, including 2,010 UK adults
- The December 2025 wave fielded from December 15 to December 18
- The figures have been weighted and are representative of all UK adults (aged 18+)

Key Findings

- Labour is crashing. It alone is continuing to lose major support and reputation. The Budget not only failed to stabilise Labour's position, it intensified the opposition. Negative feelings about the party jumped from two-thirds to three quarters. The Labour vote dropped from 24 to 18 percent. With a record 83 percent now saying country is headed in the wrong direction, Labour will likely continue to shed support.
- Labour is losing support because the budget is deeply unpopular. Only 13 percent had a positive view, and 55 percent who were very negative. That was produced by voters rejecting of the decision to raise taxes so all contribute to support our priorities and achieve fiscal stability. That was the lowest testing element of the budget.
- At a moment of major increase in worry about prices, cost of living and the economy, voters believe the government raised their taxes. That crashed the government standing on handling the economy. The poll showed a stunning 12 point rise in strong disapproval on the economy.
- Labour was also hurt by the good relations with Trump. Labour's biggest drop in approval came on the handling of Donald Trump.

Key Findings - Continued

- Voters liked the increased spending for the NHS, more tax fairness measures, raised minimum wage, pensions and help with energy, as well as tougher immigration policies. A third liked lifting the 2-child cap to lower poverty. That allowed Labour to make its gains on which party is better on addressing child poverty and making Britain fairer. It would have been different had it avoided broad tax increases in favor of a wealth tax or Council tax on pricey properties.
- And critically, a third still believe Labour will be the biggest party of the left. That means there is something in the history that has voters turning to Labour. Over 40 percent respond warmly to alternative Labour narratives about its vision and 3 percent shift to Labour at the end of the poll.
- Labour has to take account of evolving social dynamics. Polarisation around Trump is producing stronger feelings about Trump, Putin, woke policies, immigration, and the EU.
- The energy transition creates a dynamic that is being shaped by attitudes toward low carbon energy, net zero, oil and energy companies. Being seen as woke and more expensive by some is hurting, but climate remains the area of highest approval. Two thirds of targets want government to do even more.
- Labour has strong narratives that distance from Trump, align with the EU's fight for freedom and liberty, a fairer Britain that cuts taxes for working people, and a mission to drive down child poverty.

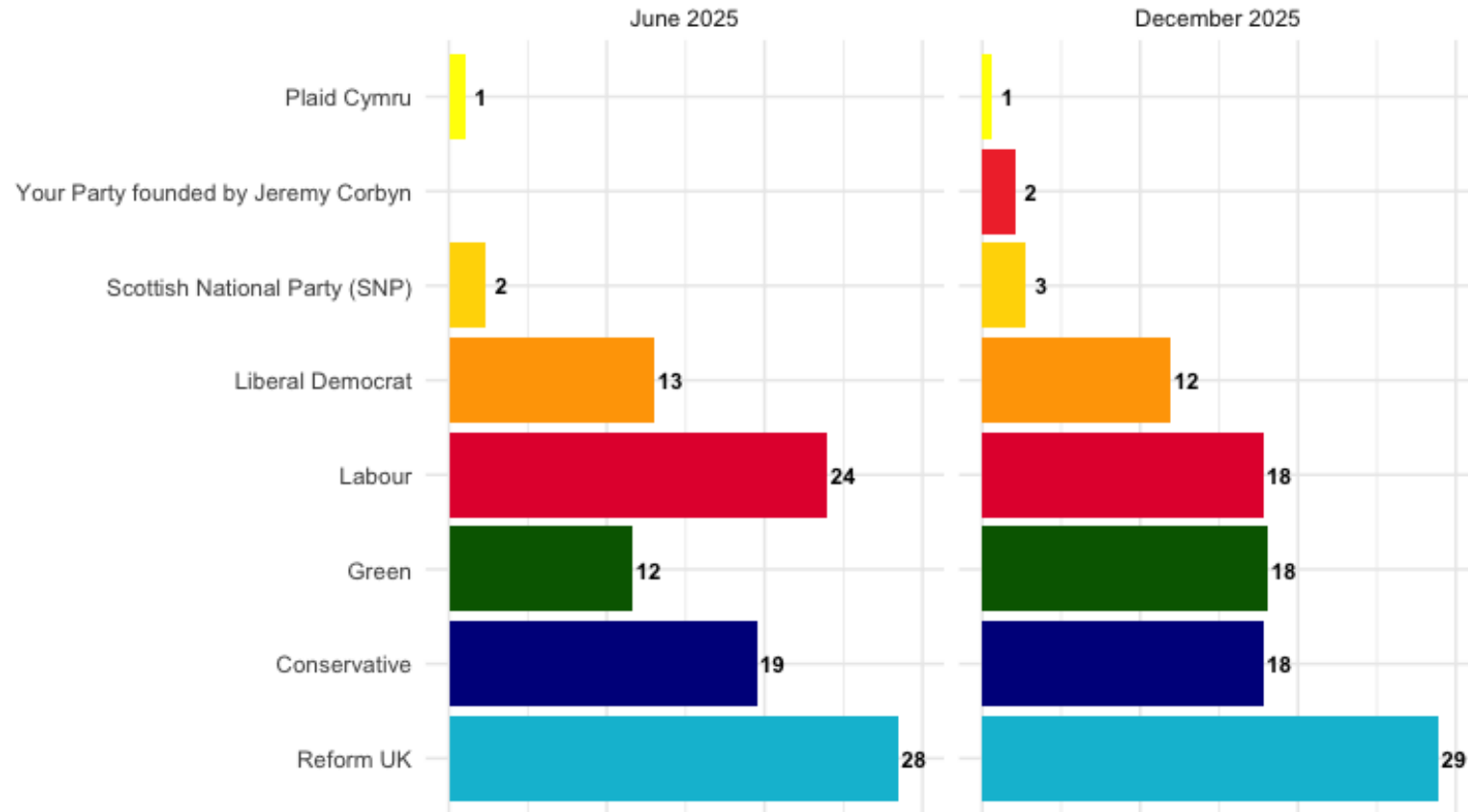
Key Findings - Continued

- The results are encouraging on whether Labour be run as a major party that get can get 40 percent of the vote.
- The climate superpower narrative includes natural gas in transition and net zero as a goal driving investment to achieve secure and affordable energy.
- Labour narratives that address major national issues and solutions get more than 40 percent of voters saying, they feel more positive about the Labour Party. The narratives address those challenges at an elevated level and show Labour will bring change.
- After hearing all the narratives, including immigration, 37 percent say, Labour will the largest party of the left. Immigration is an existential issue for voters, and Labour earns the right to govern when it addresses all the major issues facing the country.
- The narratives raise Labour's standing on the cost of living and the vote by 3 points. At a time when Labour is crashing, this poll shows that Labour can set out on a very different trajectory.
- Labour must embrace a mission for Britain to lead on raising the cost of living for working people with reduced taxes and rising incomes, slashing childhood poverty, fighting the climate crisis, challenging Trump's agenda, & fighting in Europe for raised living standards, democracy & freedom.

Labour Drops to 18 Percent in favor of Greens and Your Party, while no change in conservative-nationalist bloc

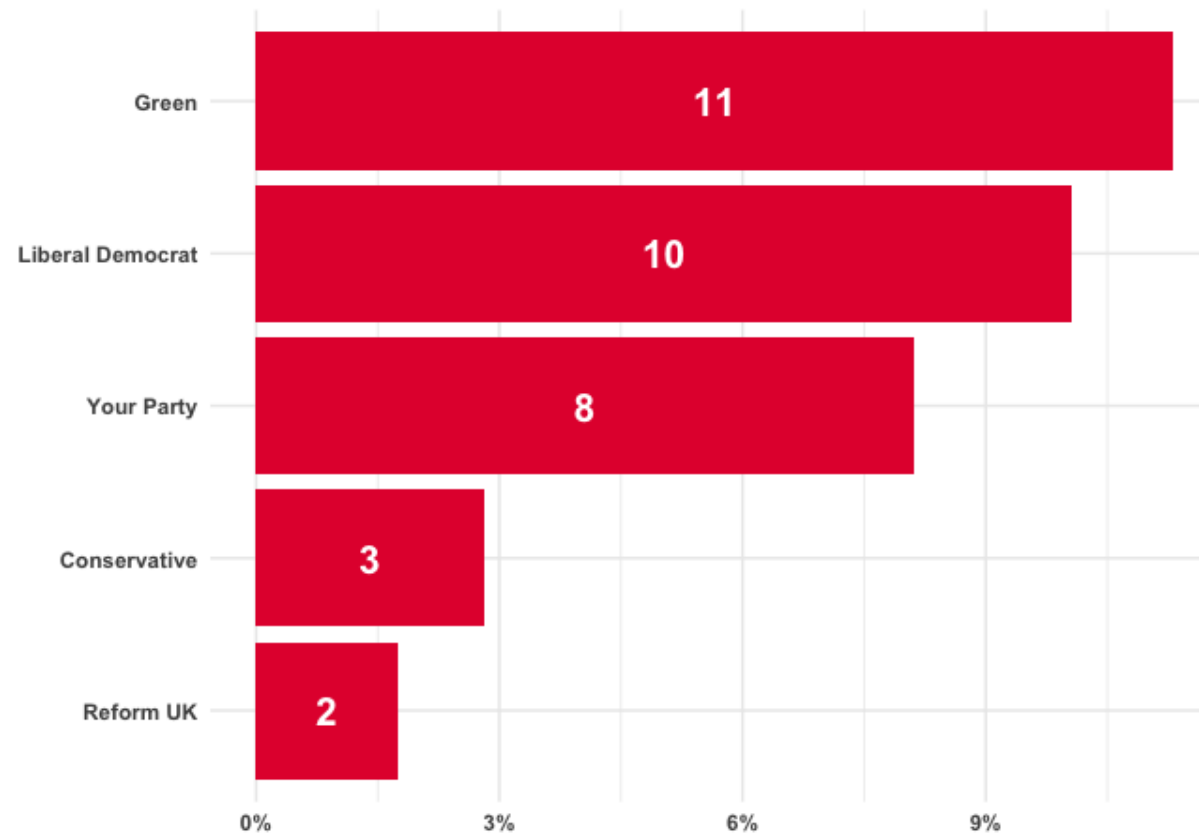
Second tier of Labour, Green, Conservatives roughly tied

About 10 Percent of Left-liberal Bloc Open to Labour, Only 2 Percent of Reform Voters

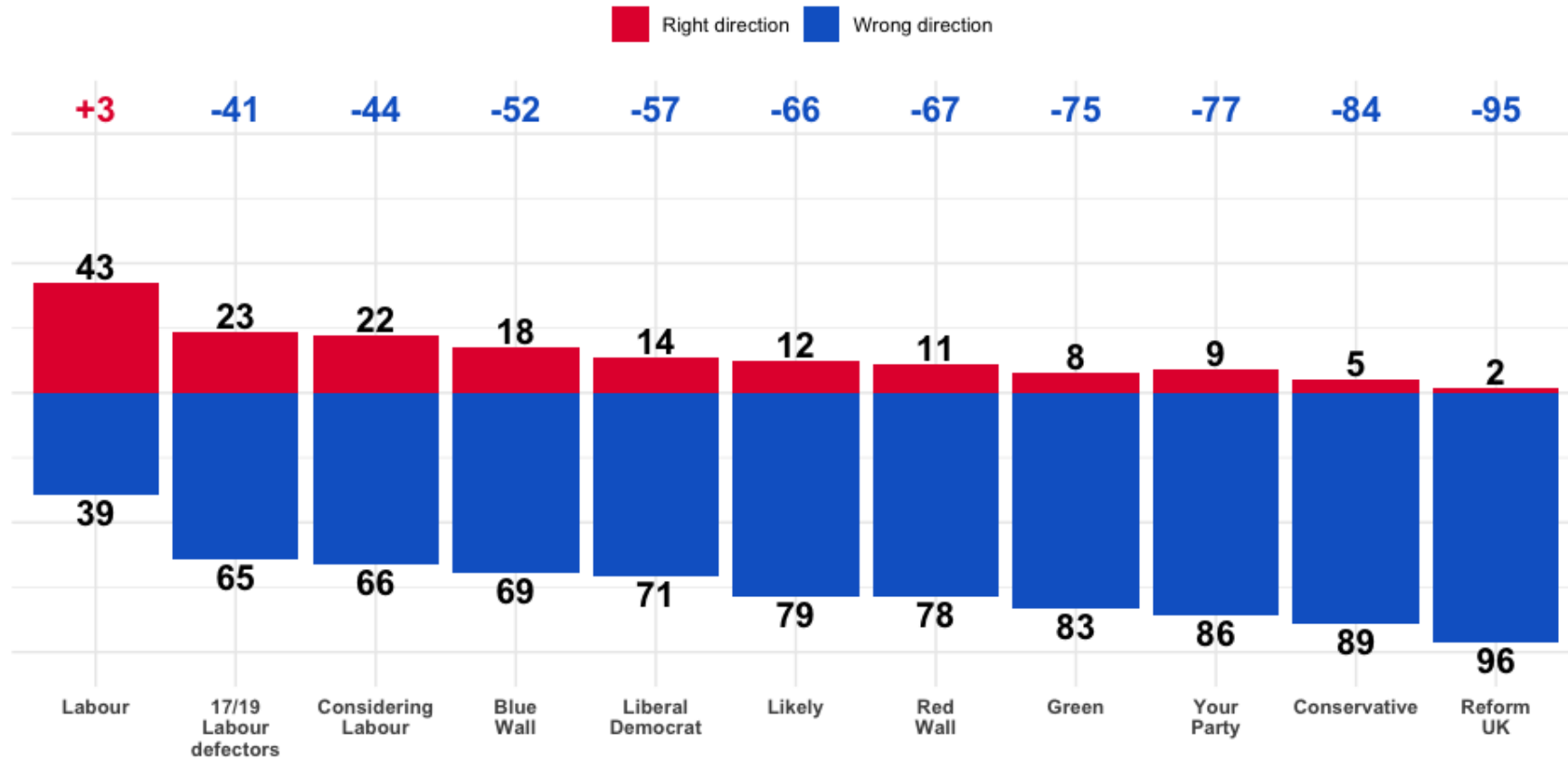

Image of all parties amazing stable, except the Labour Party. Negative sentiment grew from two thirds of voters to three quarters.

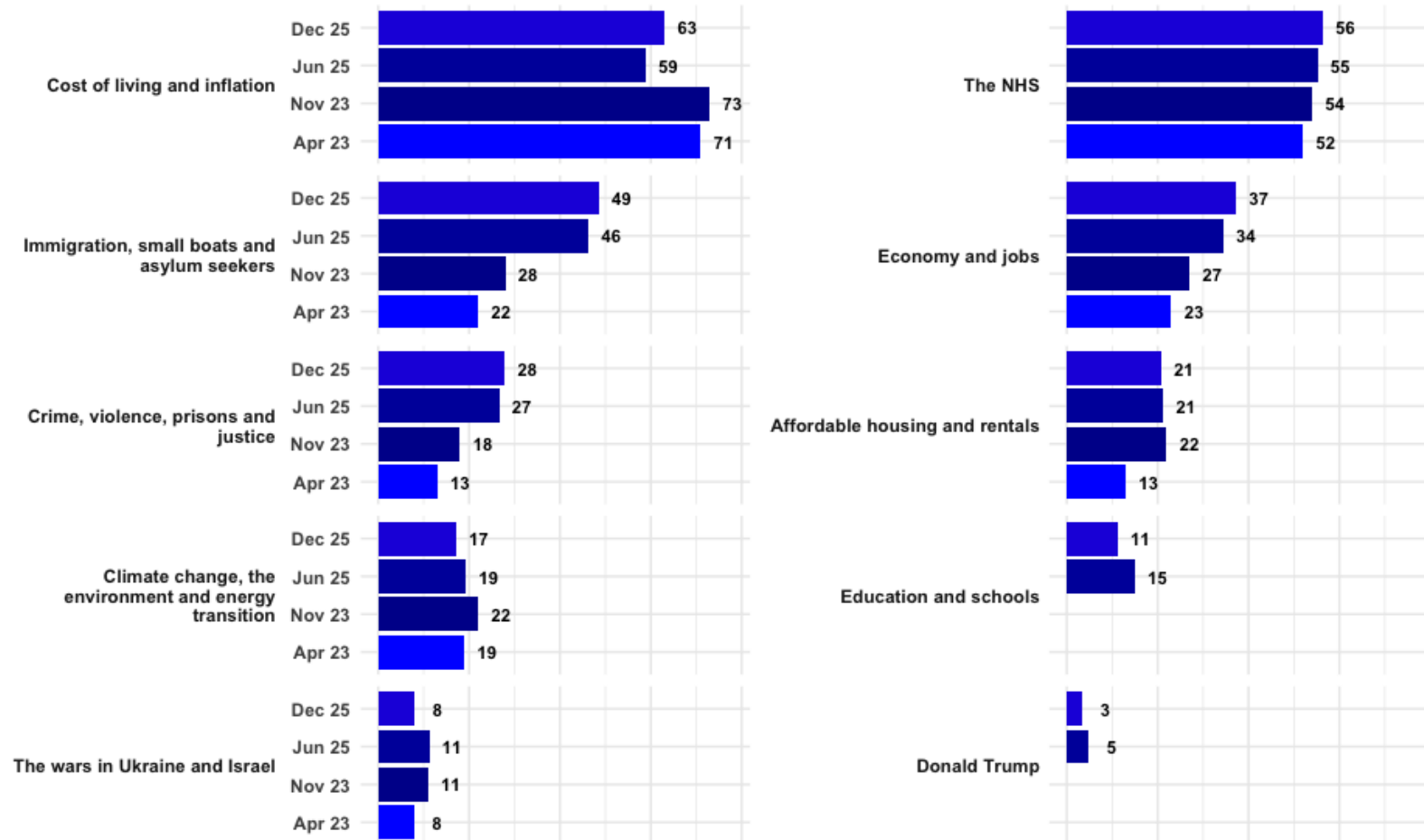

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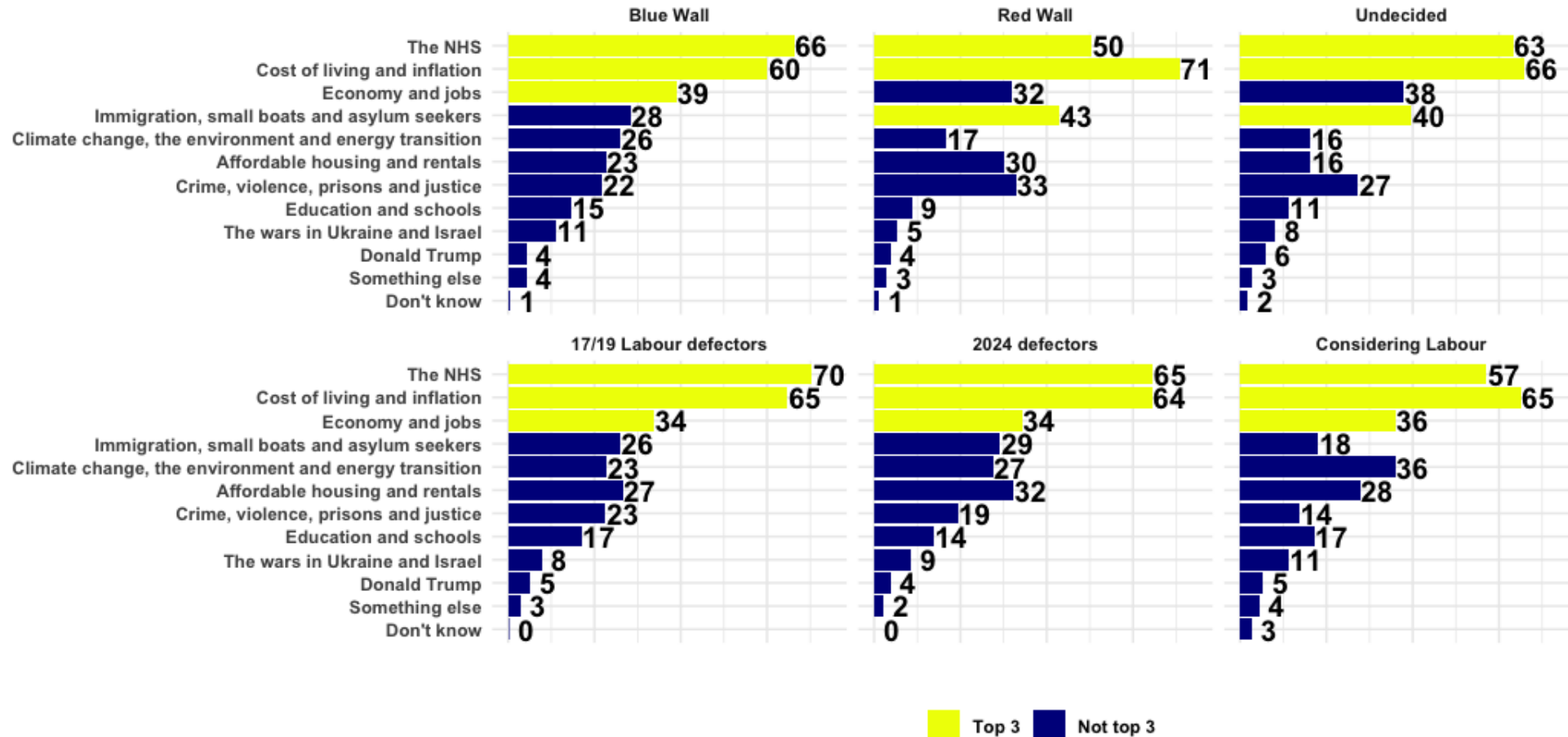
Cost of living, economy and immigration show major increased in concern

Climate concern dropping



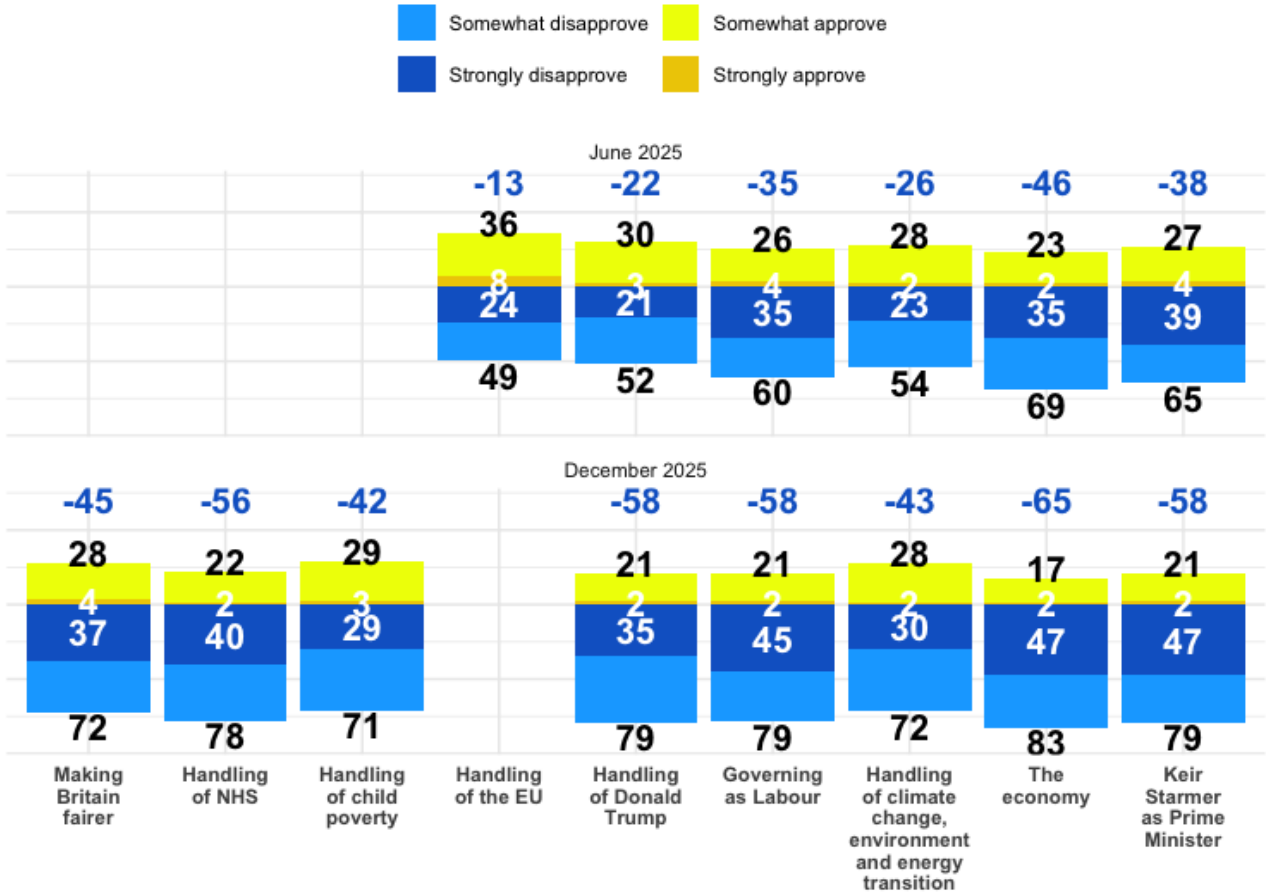
Cost of Living Surges to Top in Red Wall but same for NHS in Blue Wall

Starmer approval on economy falls to to below vote; strong disapprove jumps 12 points. Making Britain fairer and handling child poverty well above vote.

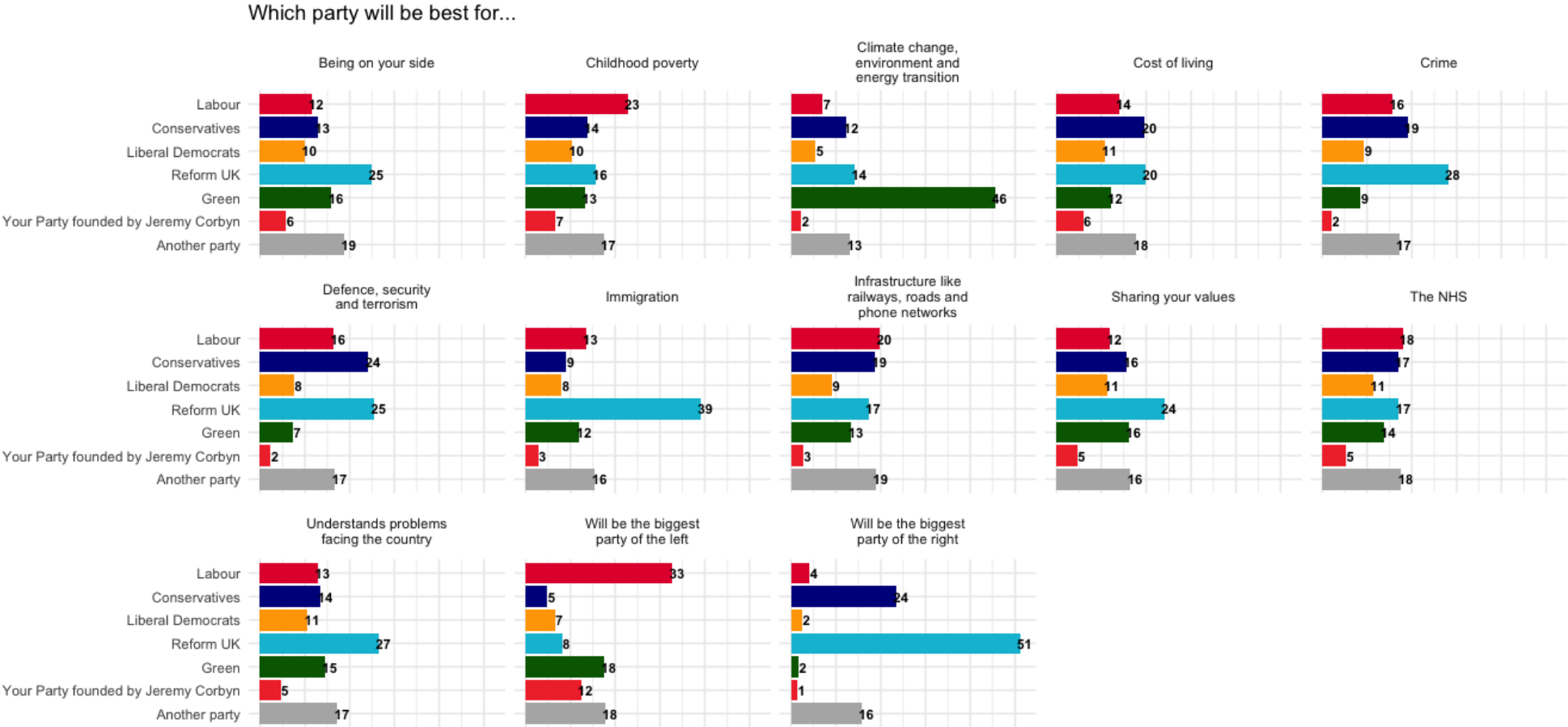
Majorities disapprove of the Starmer government's performance. Government has lost ground in every question that was re-asked with the largest decline on handling of Trump.

Labour at only 14 percent on top problems, cost of living and immigration, though above or at vote with childhood poverty and NHS. A third expect will be the biggest party of left

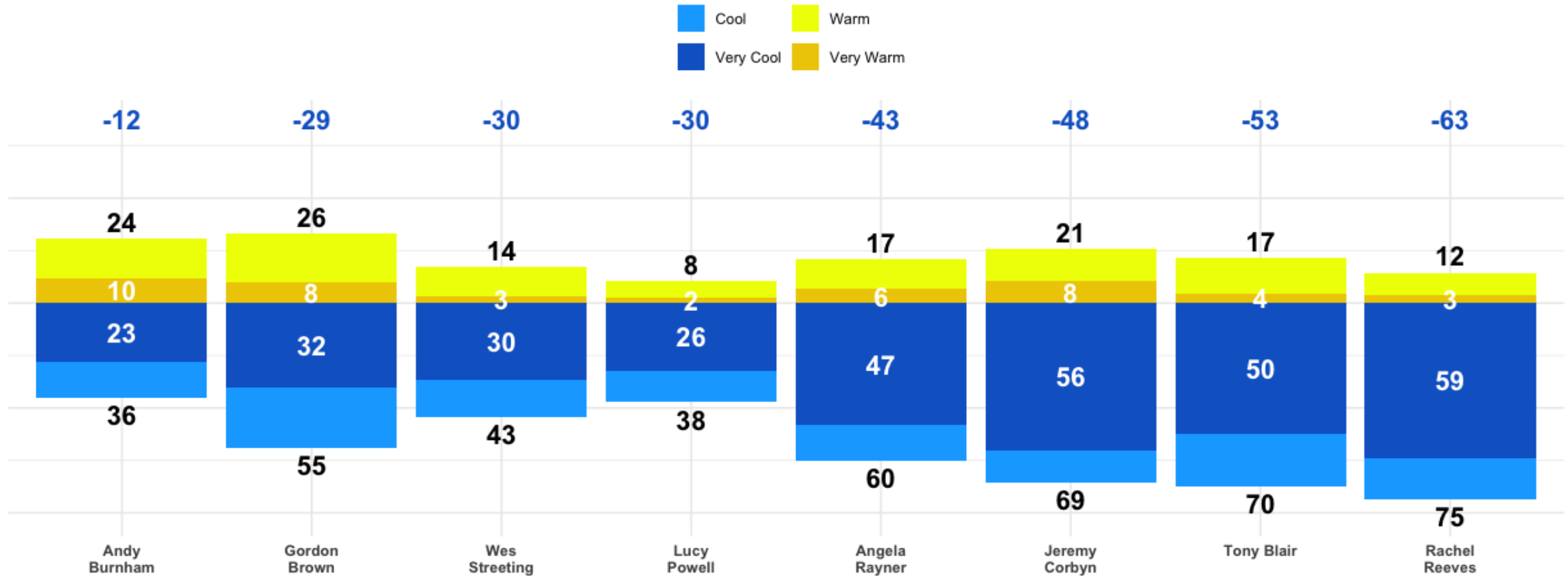

Gordon Brown has highest favorability

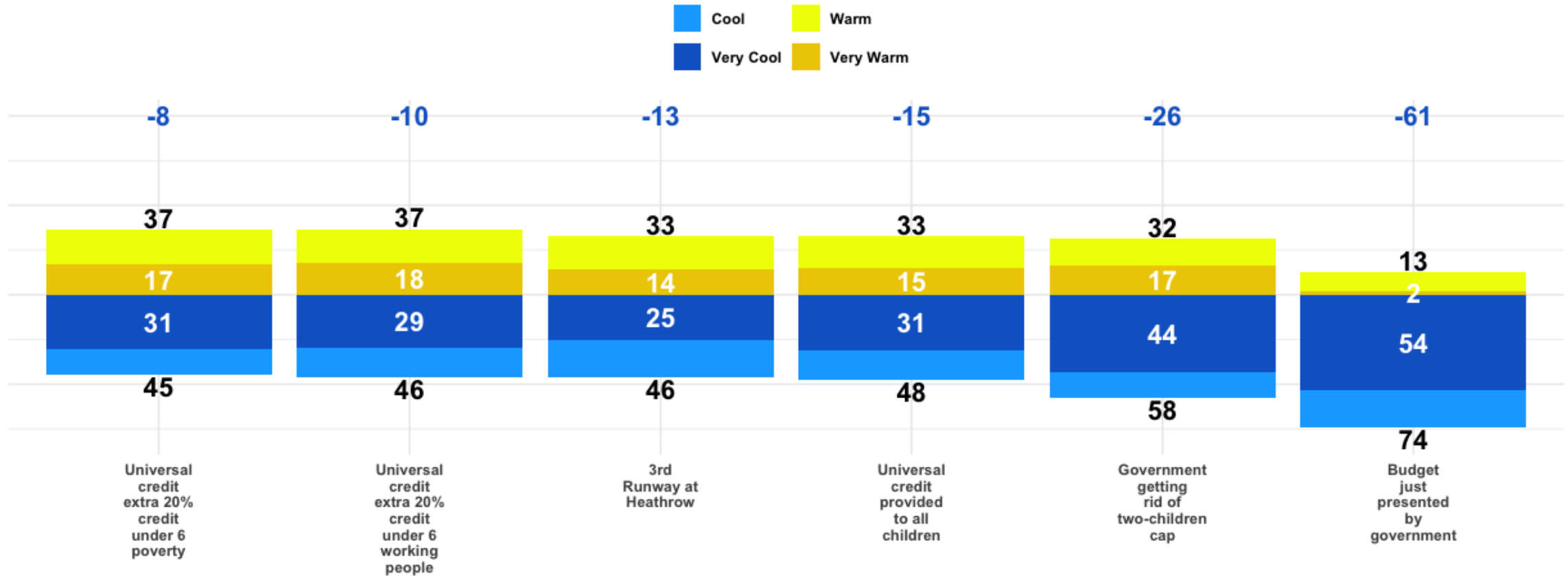

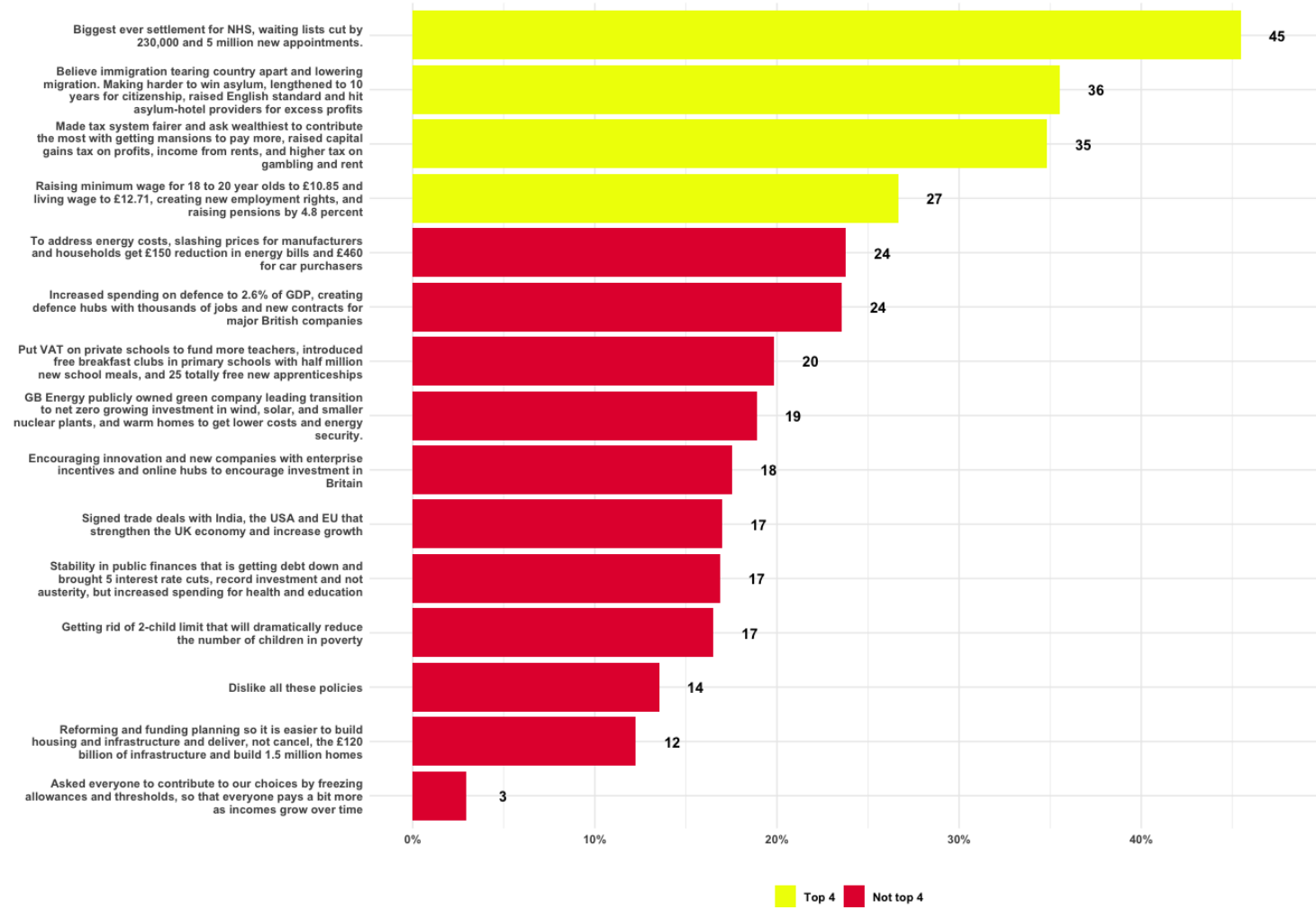

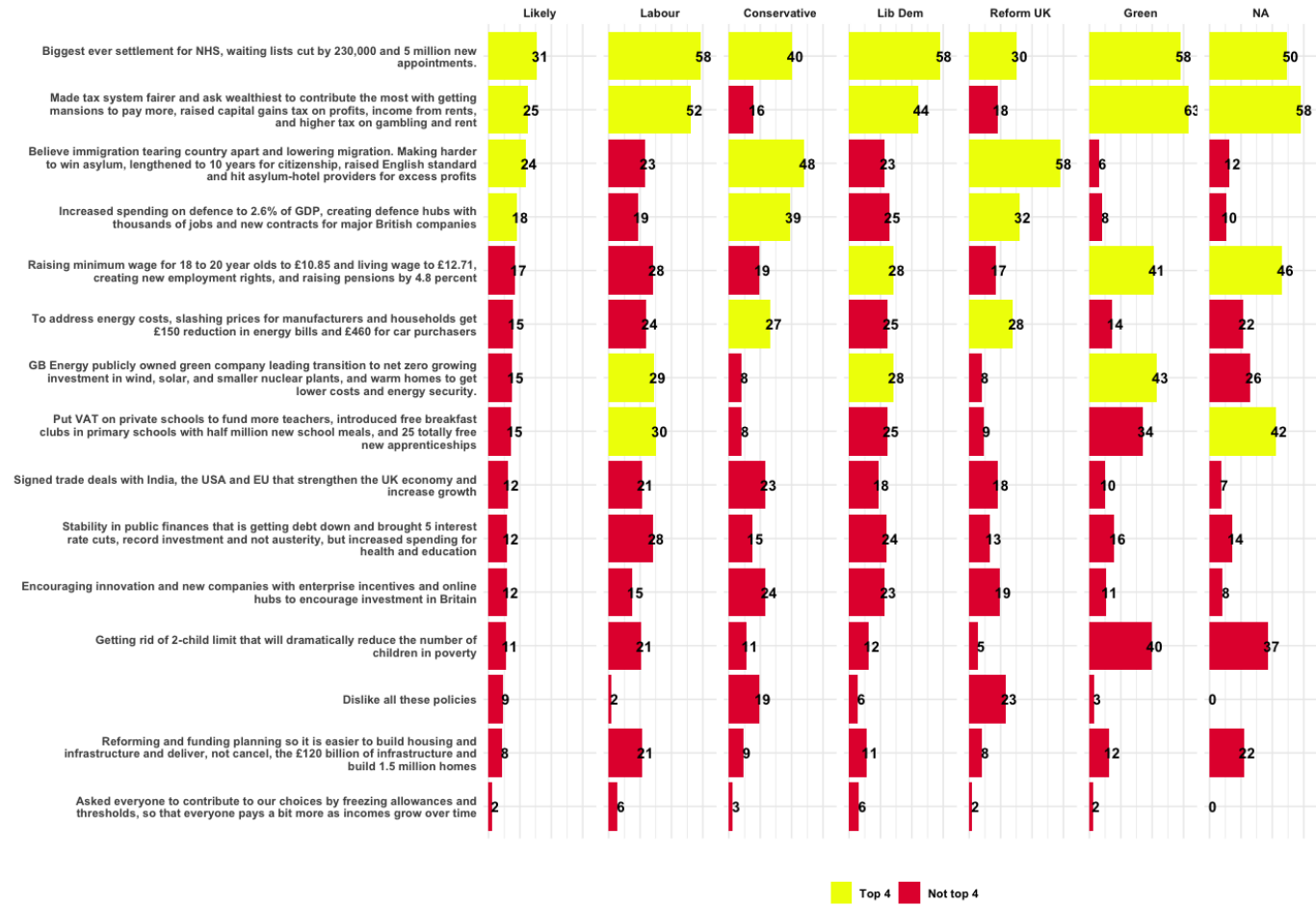

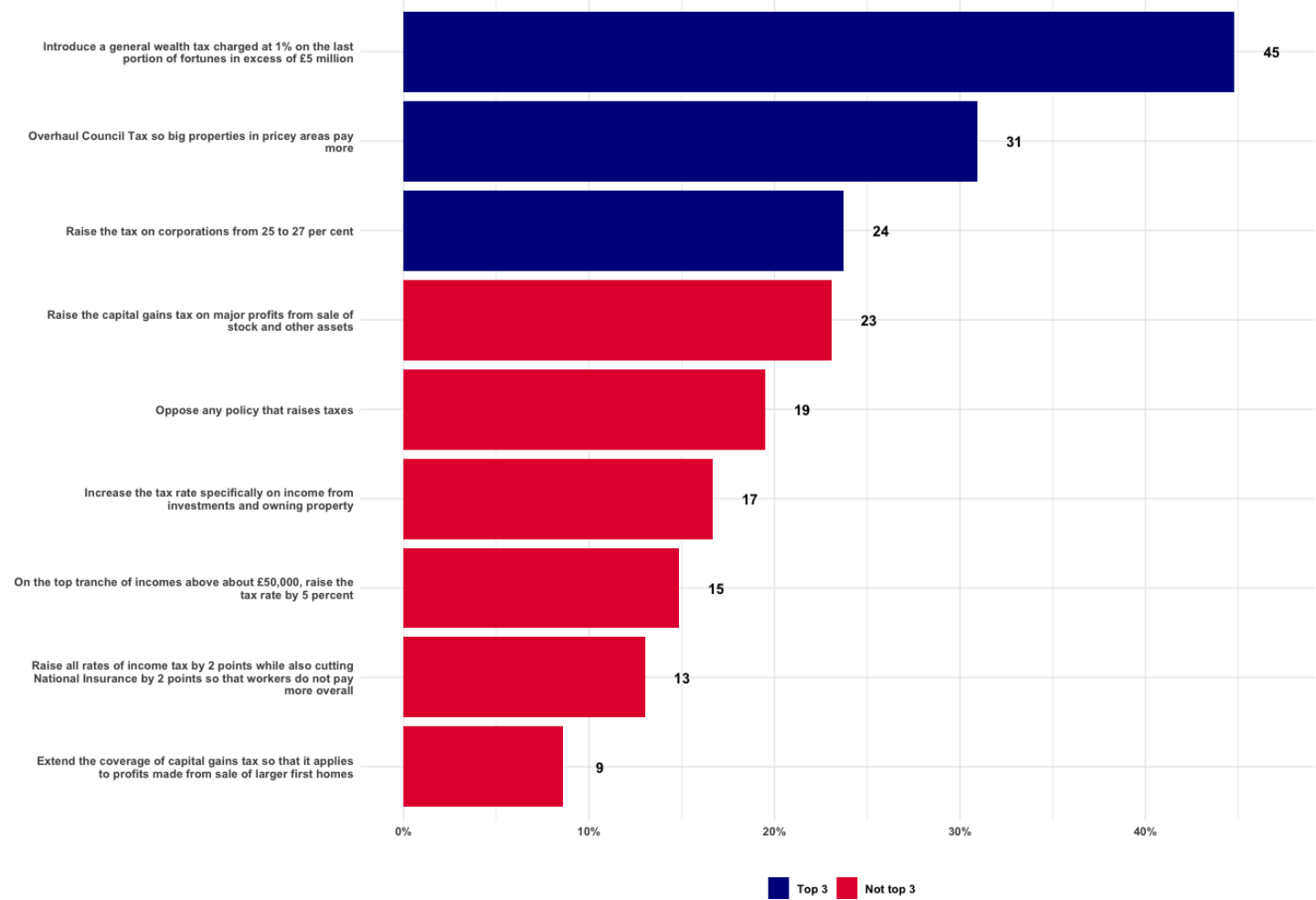

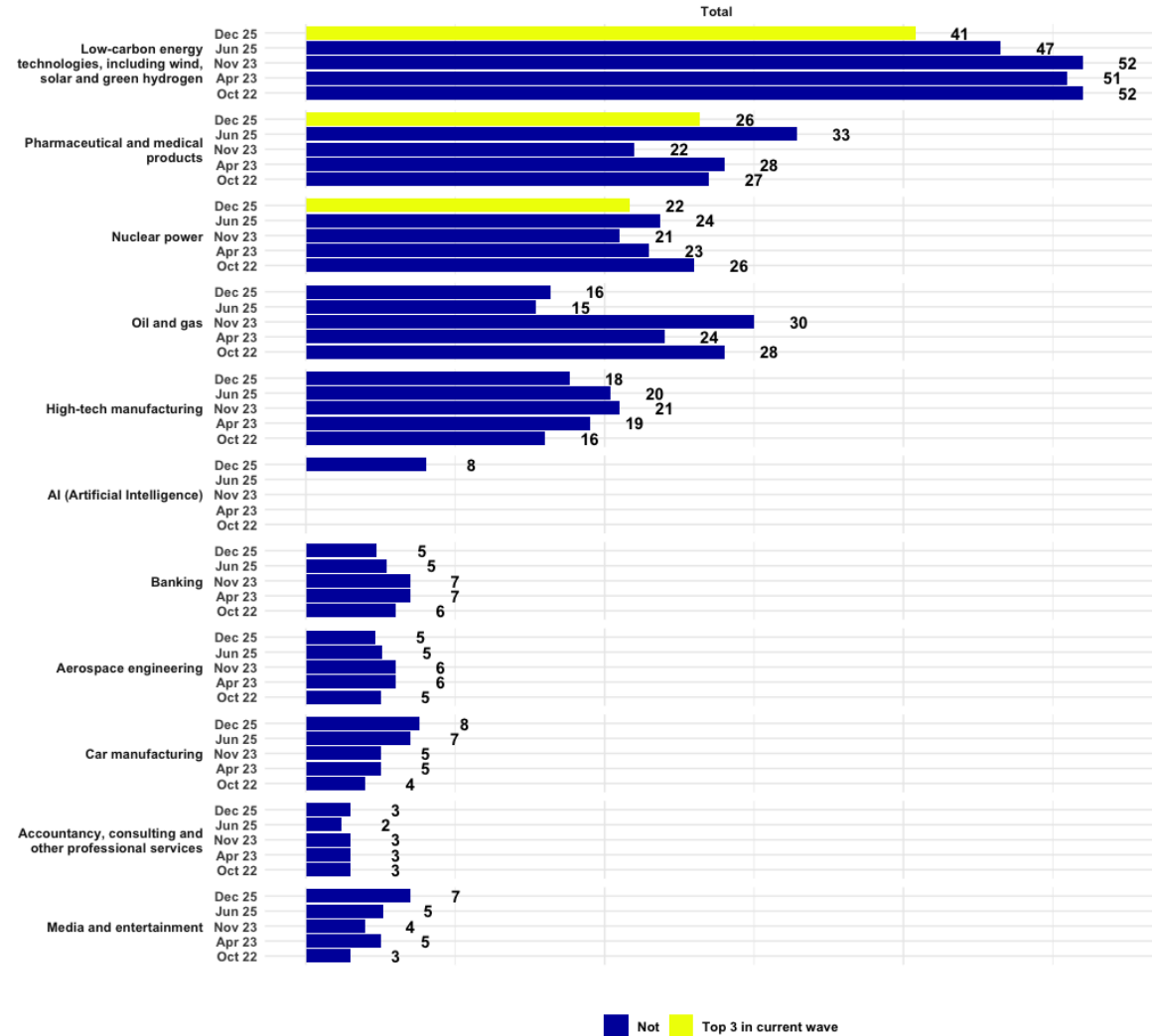

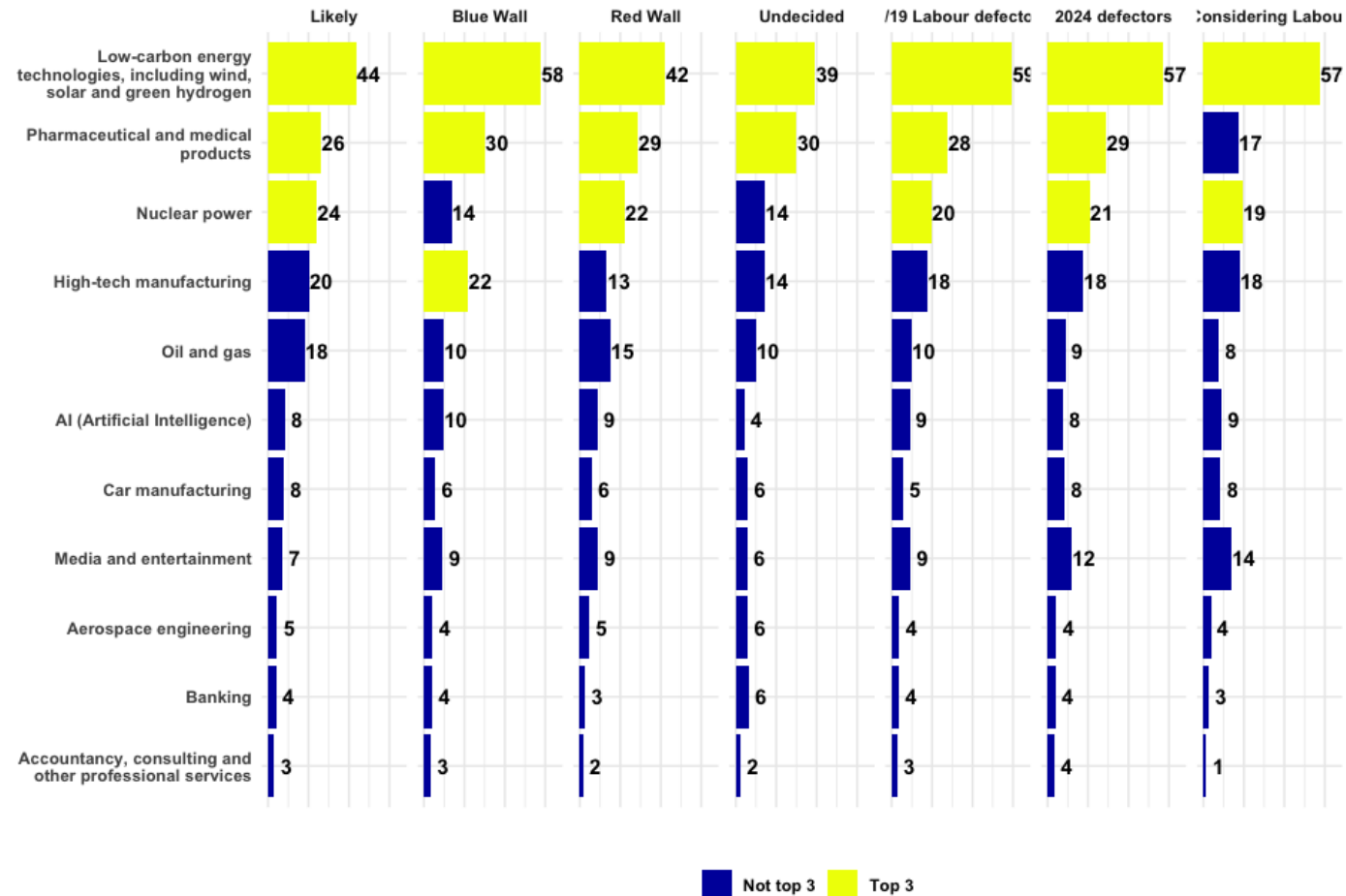

The government supporting low carbon sector strong priority for all Labour targets

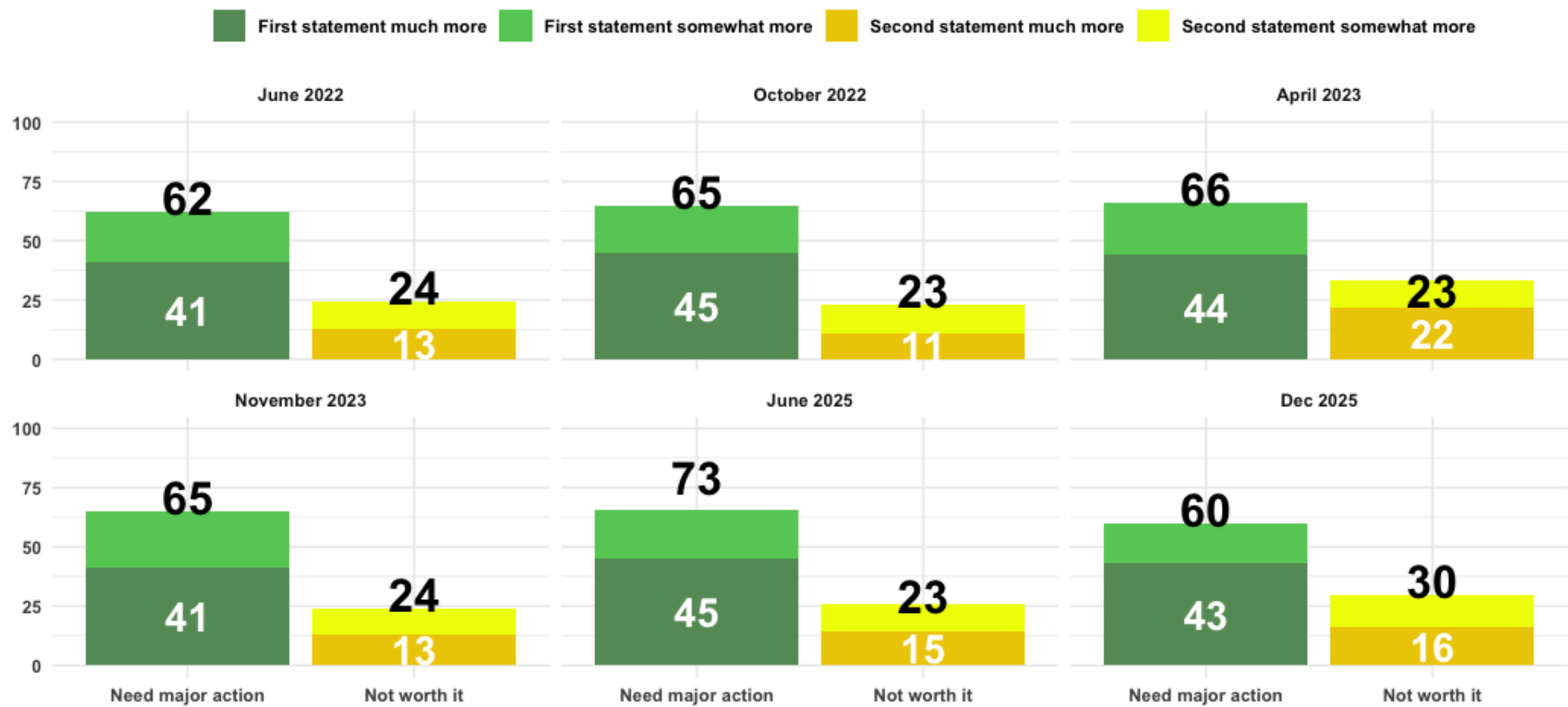

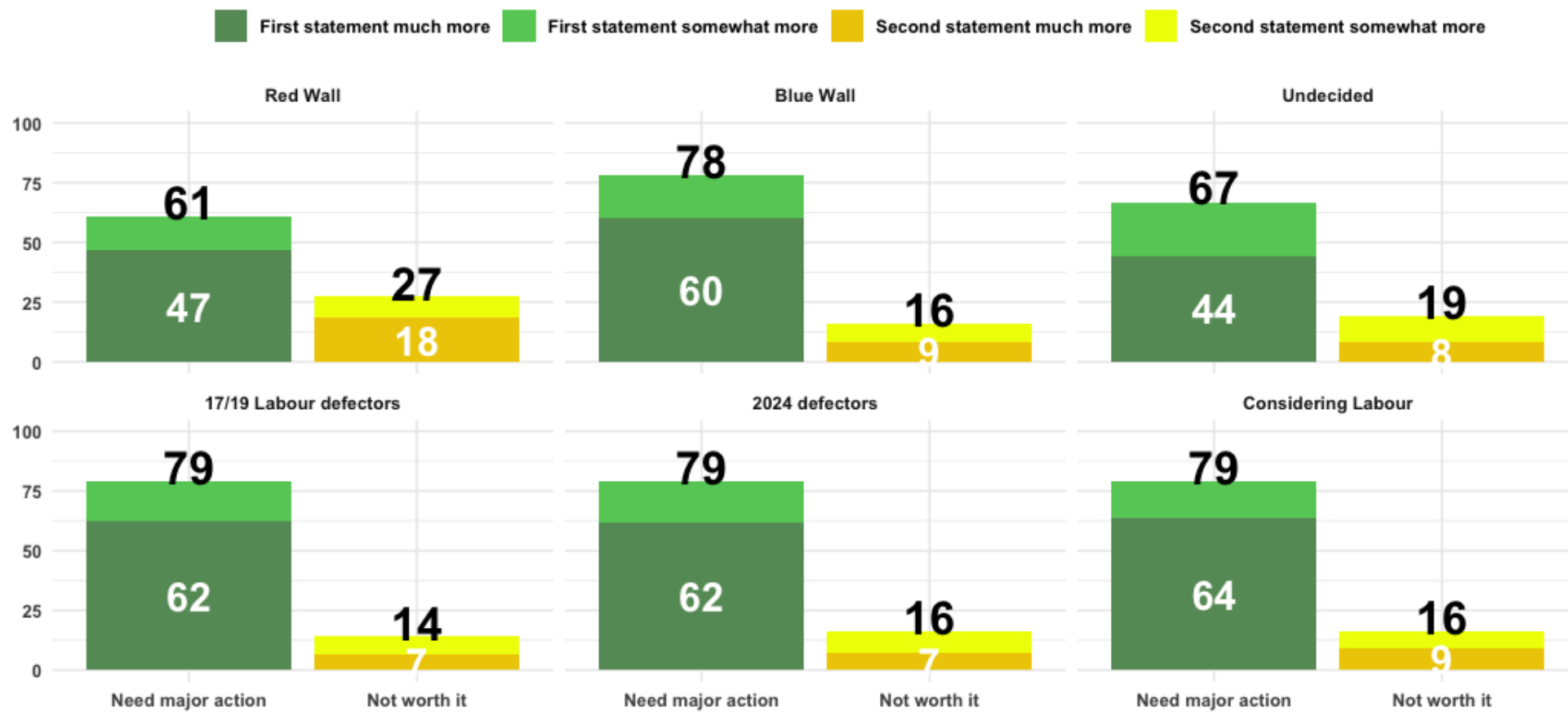

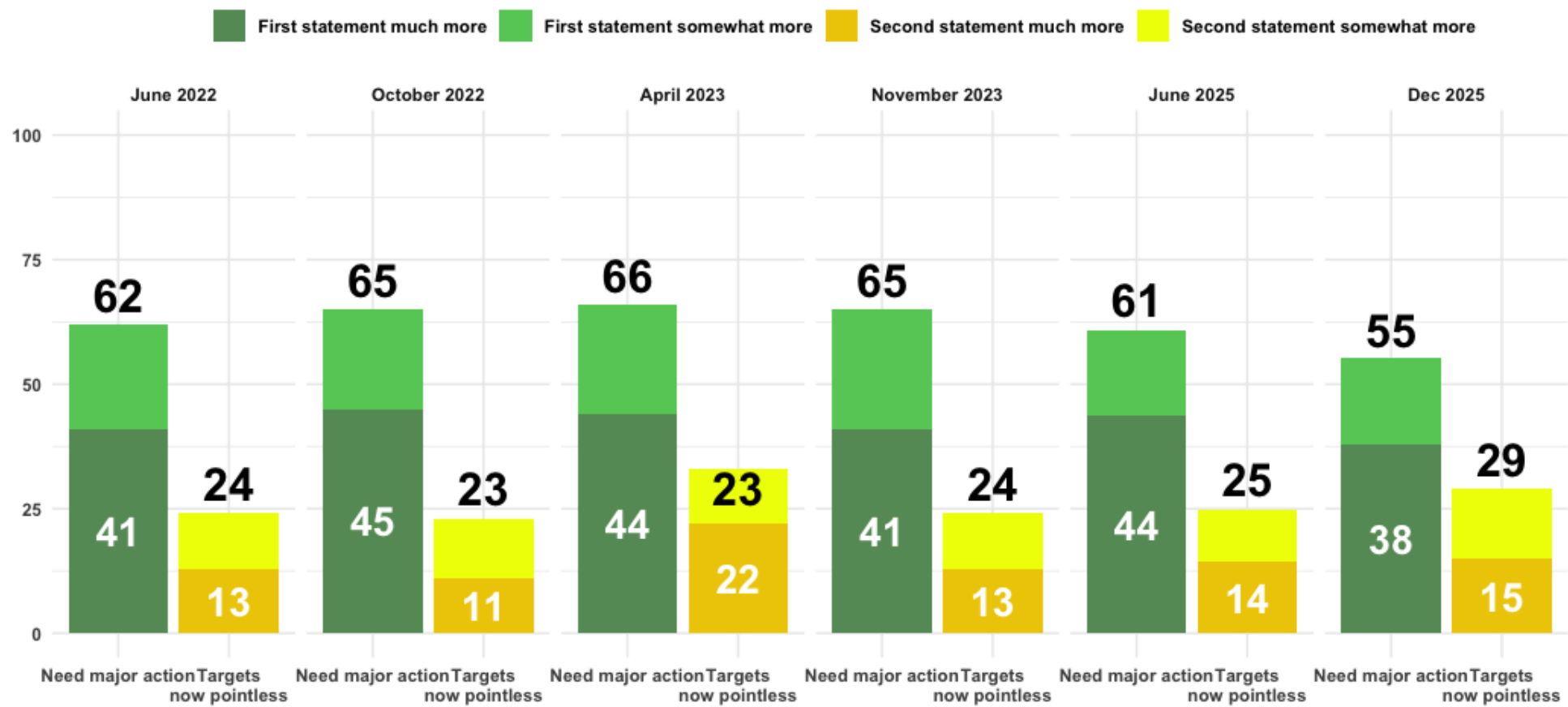


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Big Intense majority still key to act, despite US action

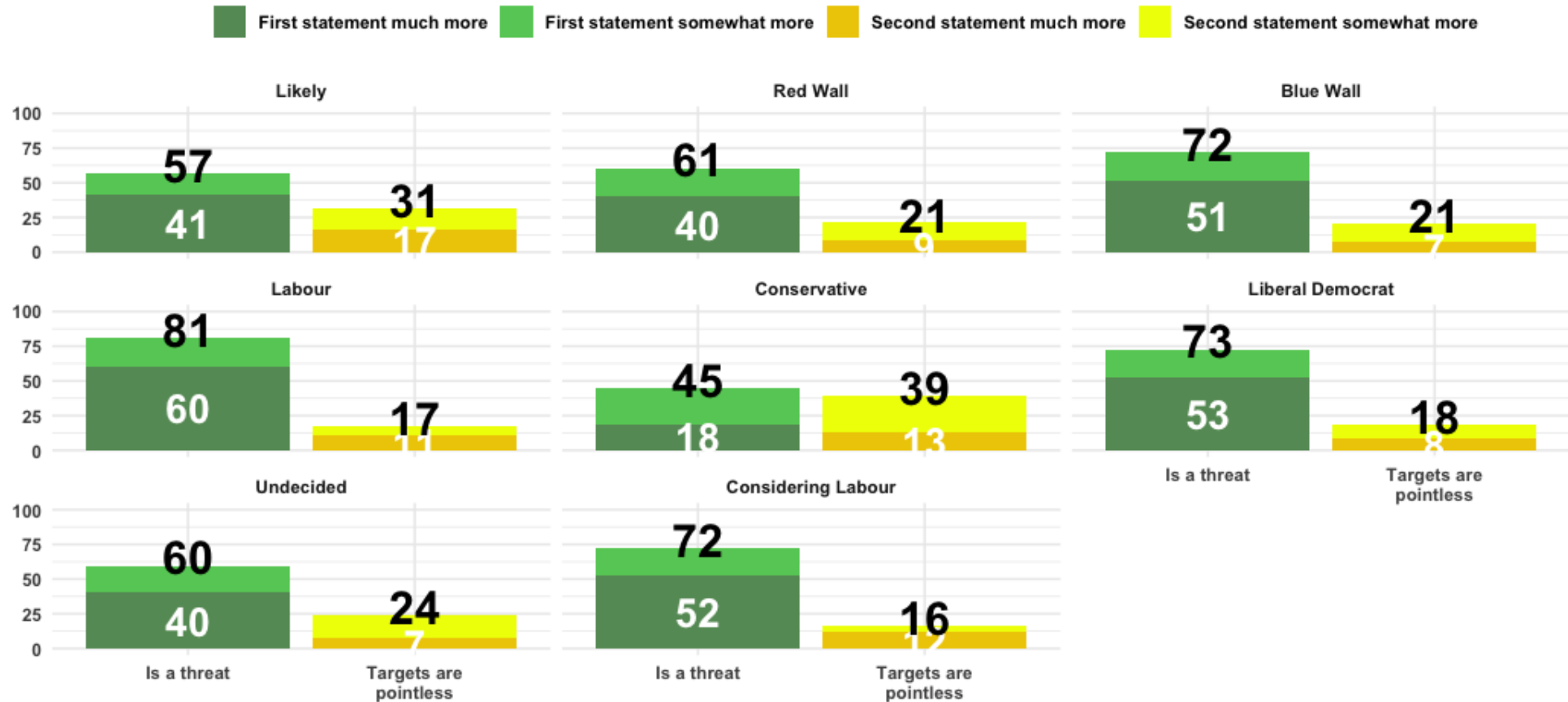

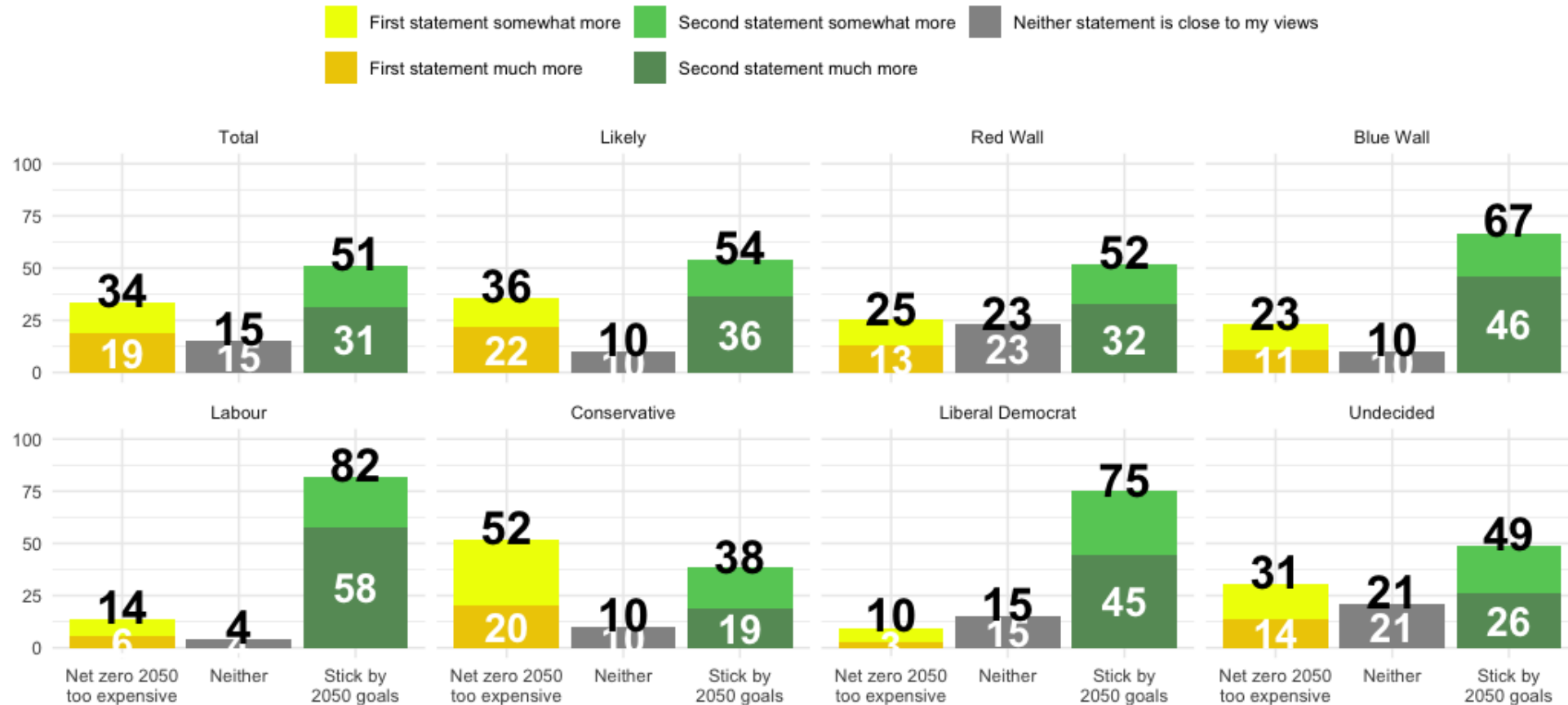

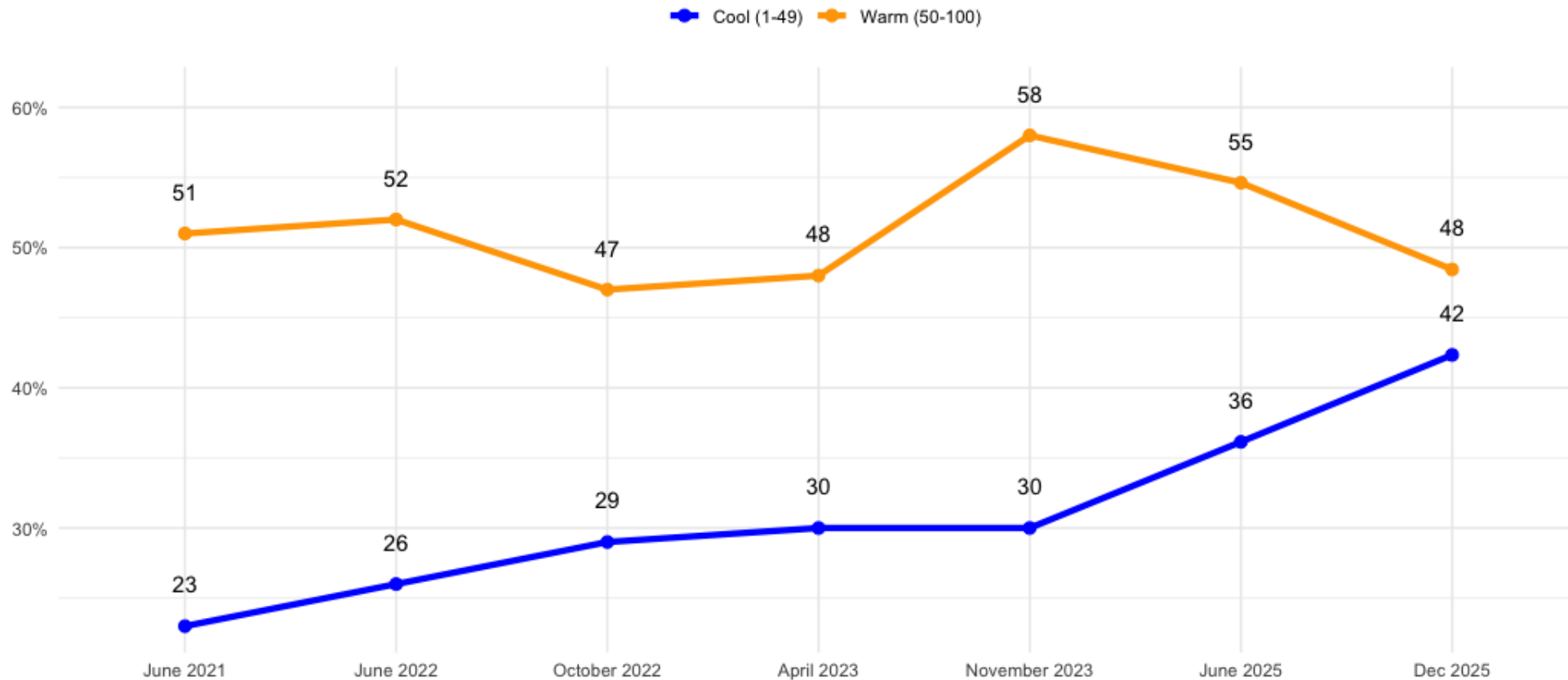

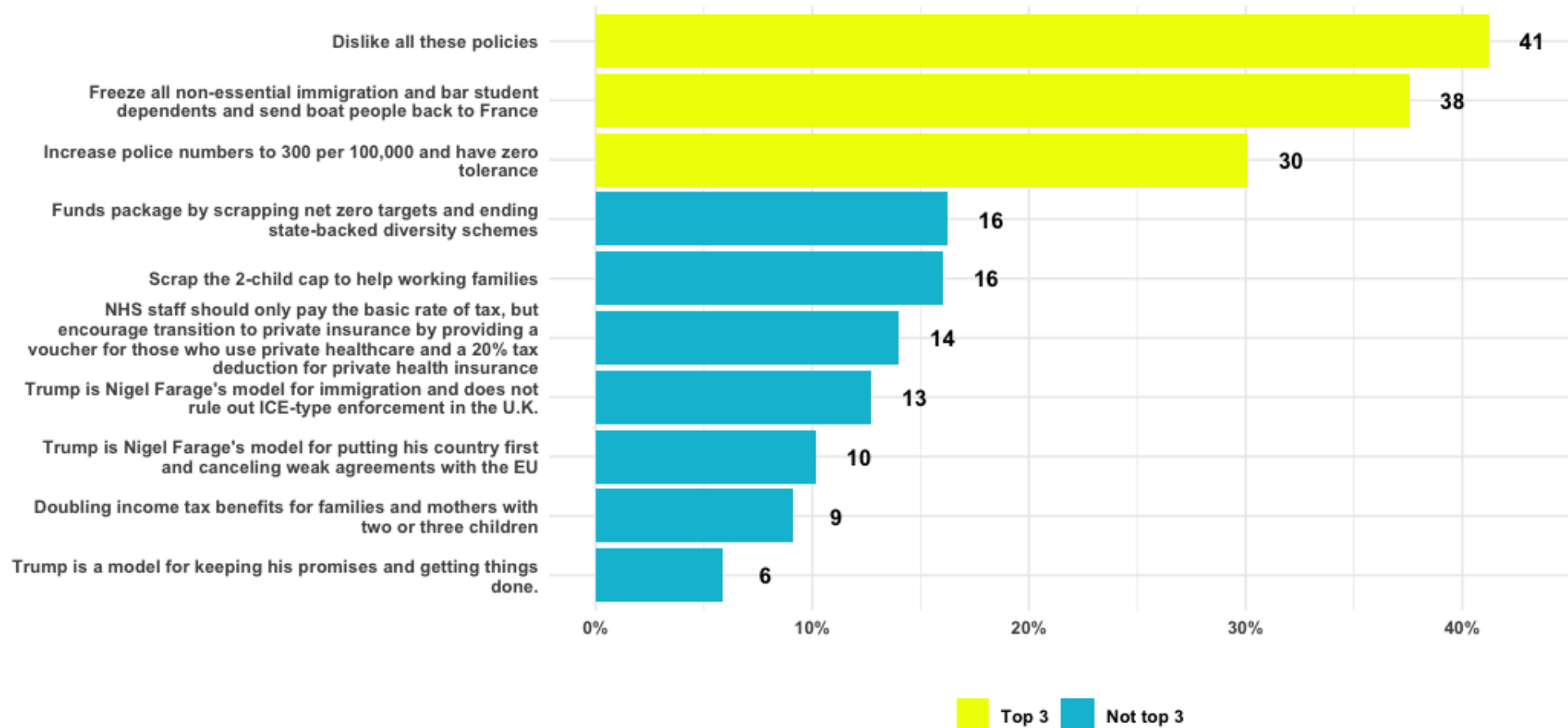

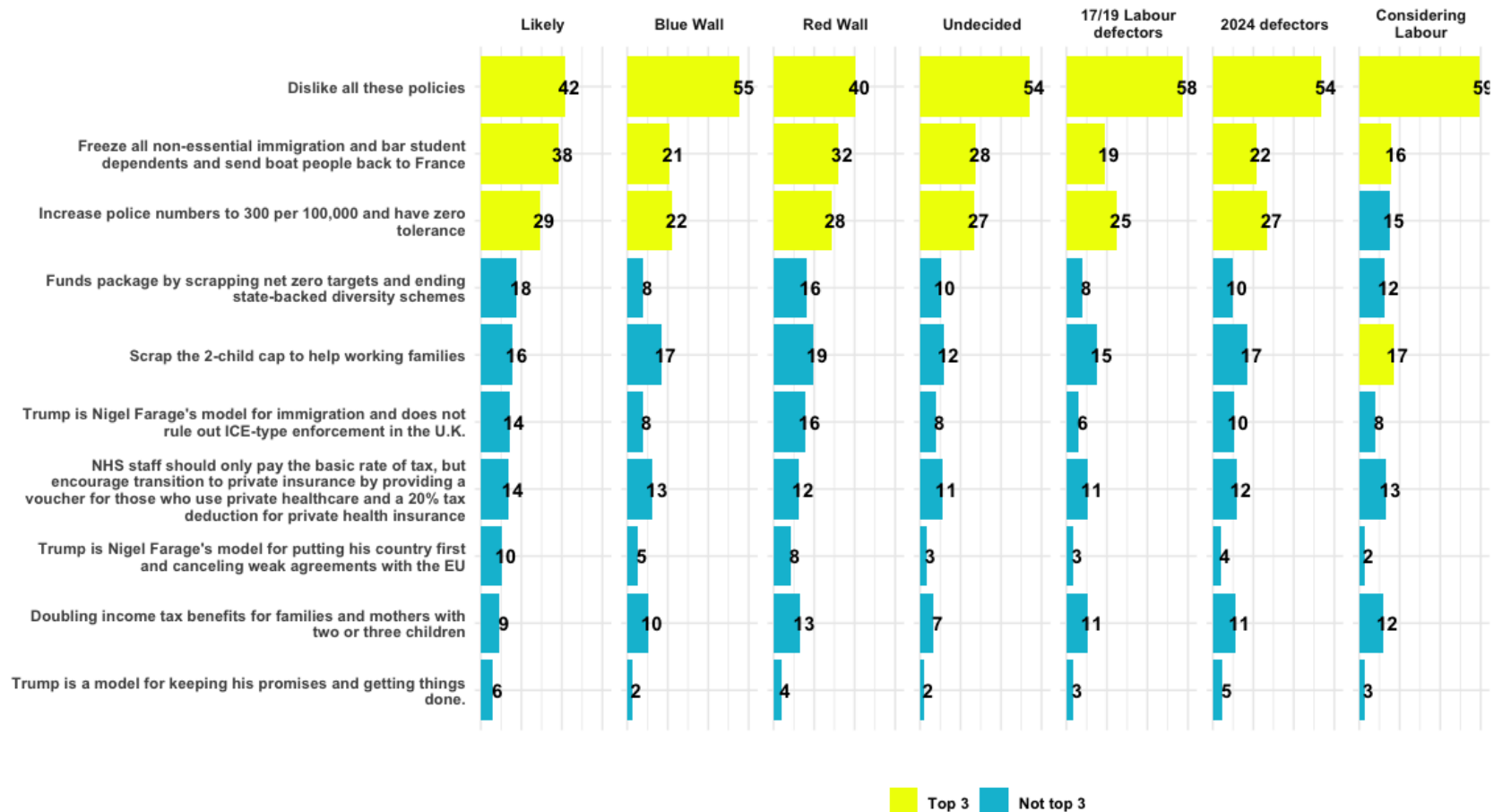

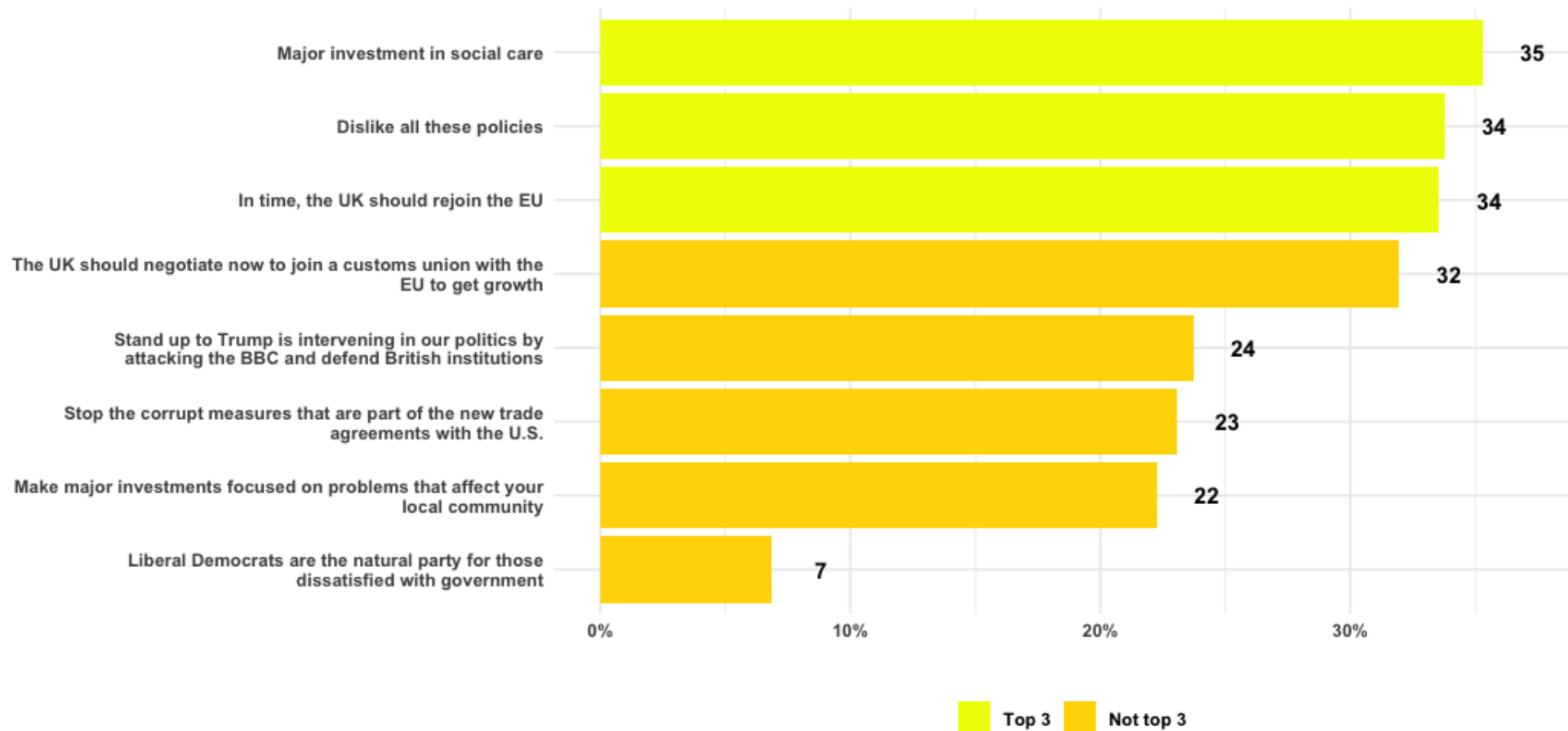

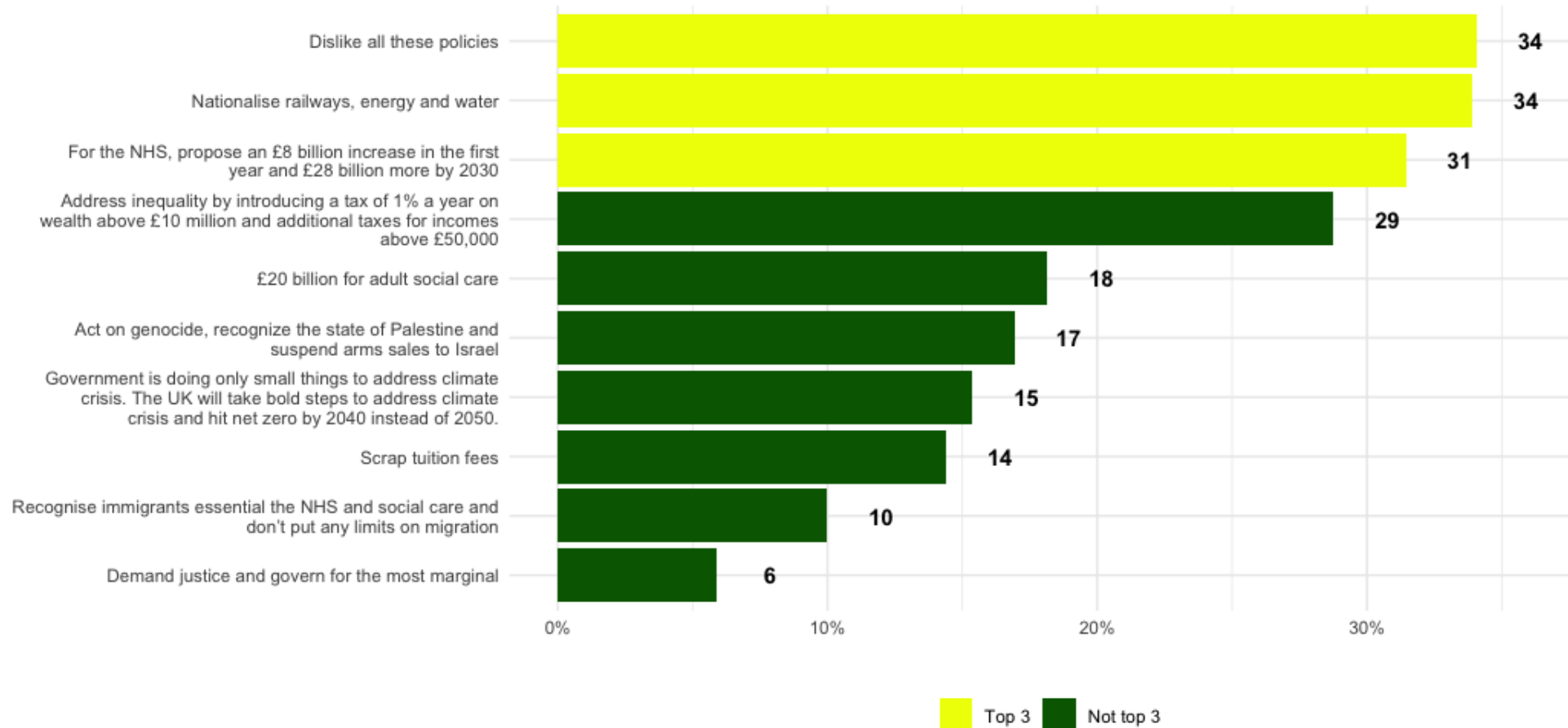

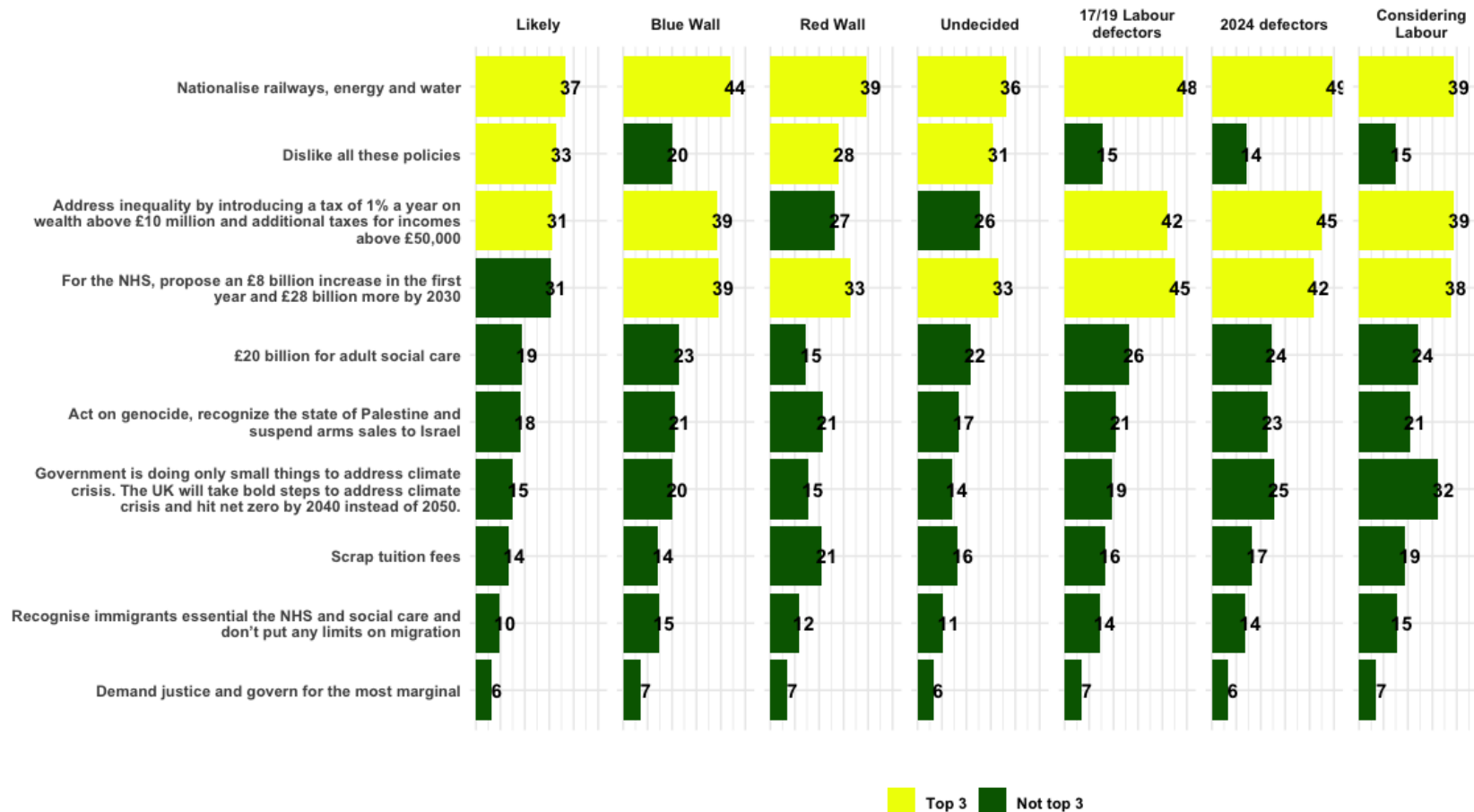

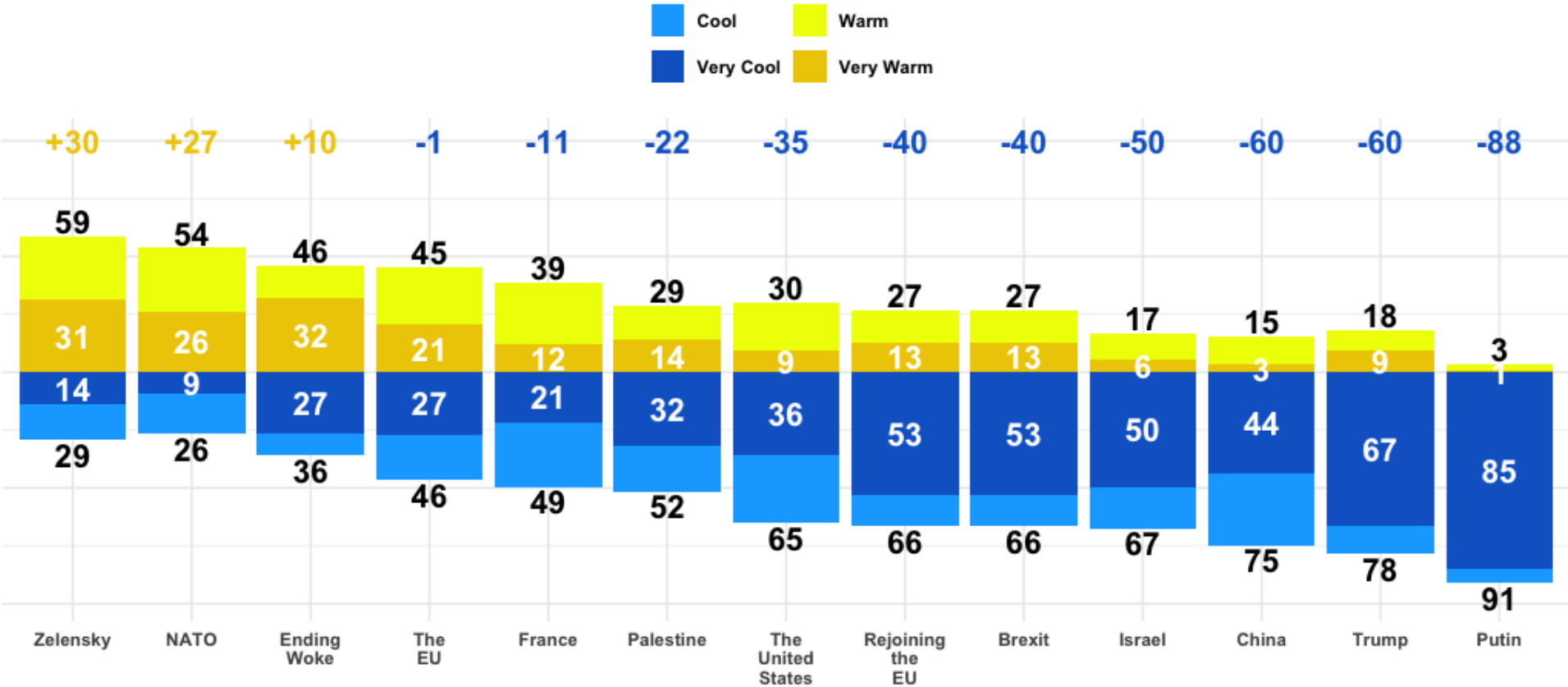

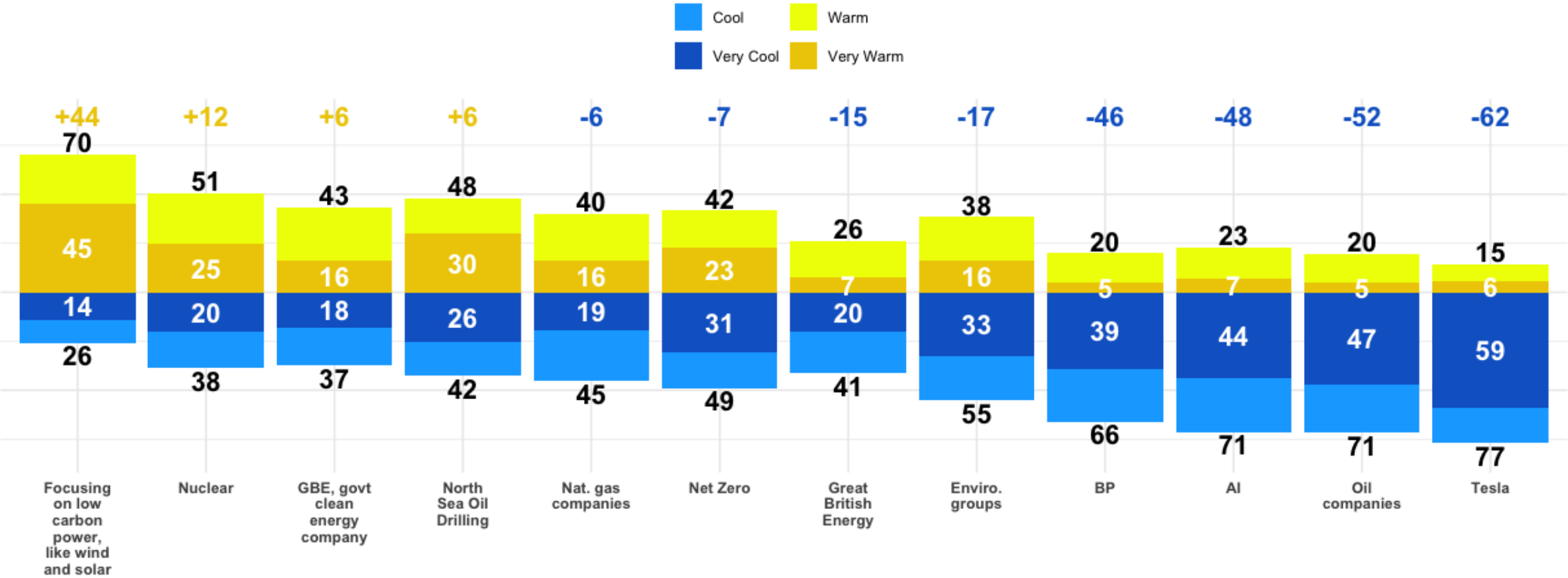

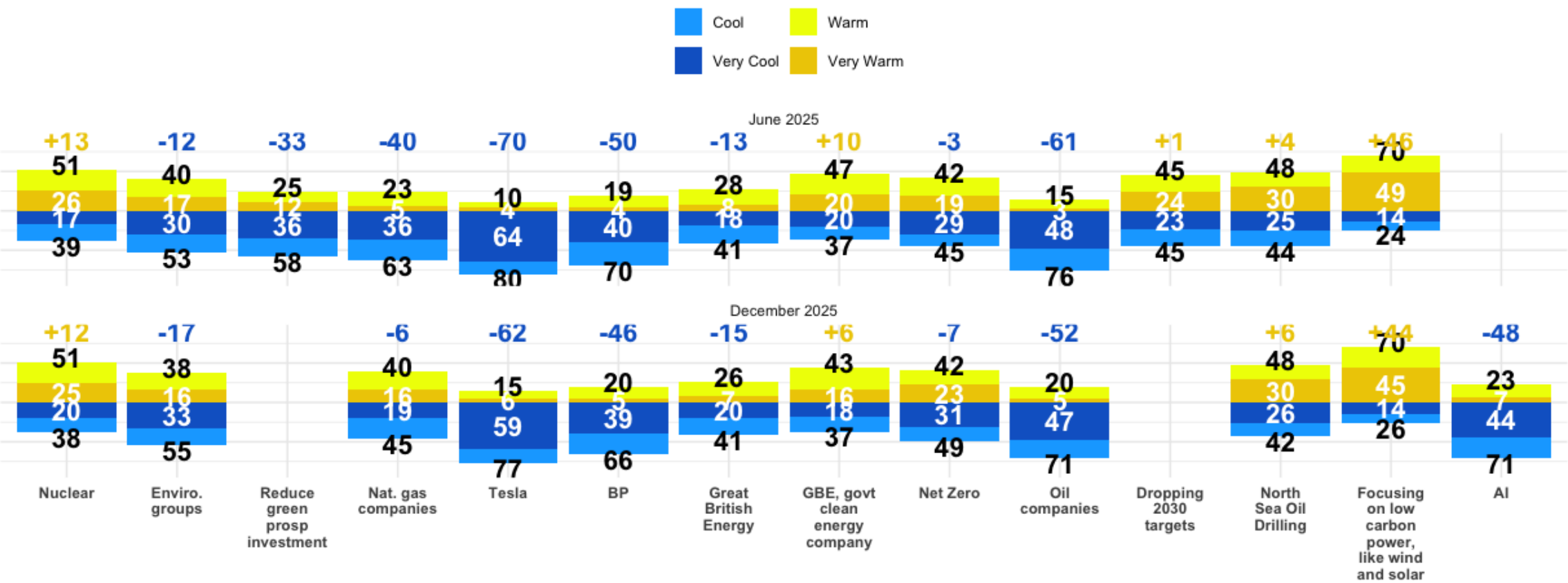
Country now breaks against net zero



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Views mostly stable, except oil companies more negative and natural gas companies more positive

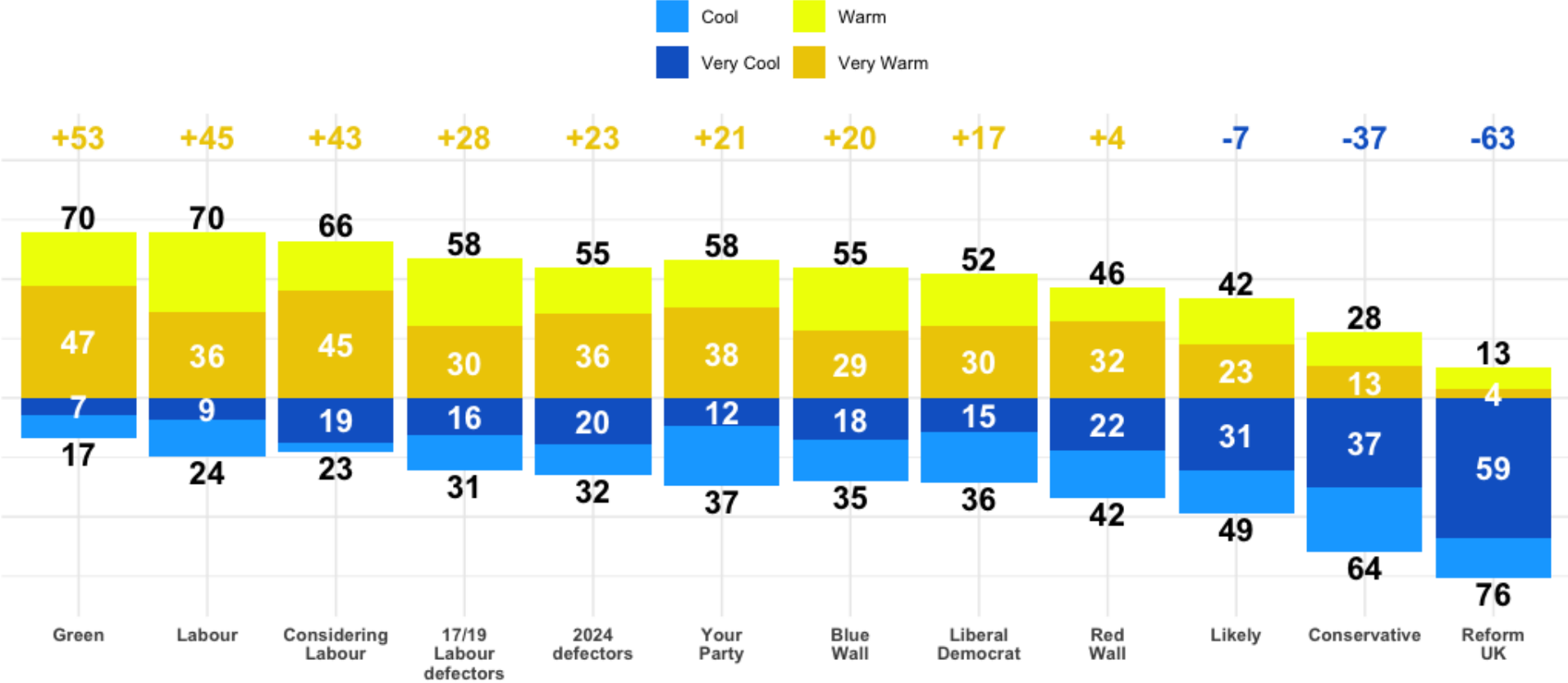
High support for low carbon power continues

Likely voters overall less supportive of Net Zero



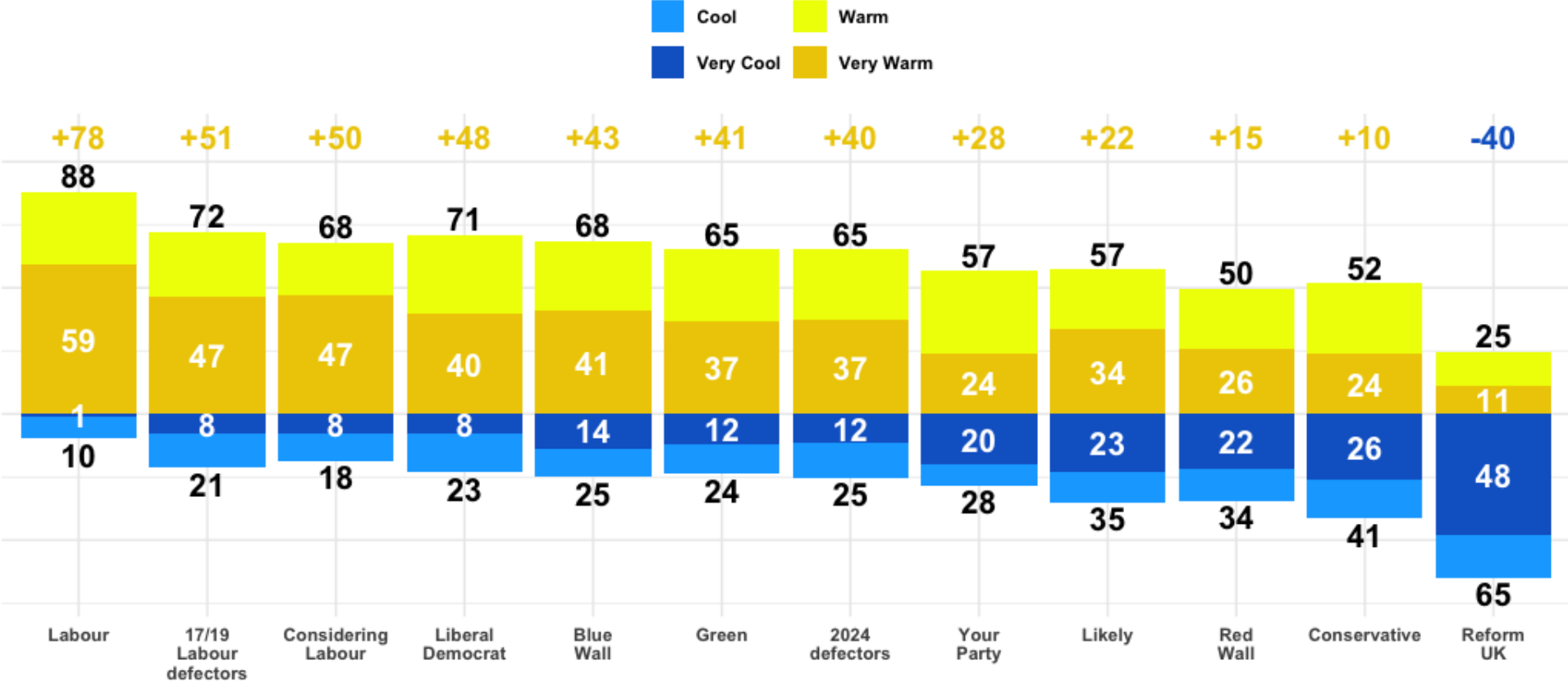
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Labour Message Narratives

Being honest on Donald Trump produces intense positive result, including all defectors & those considering Labour

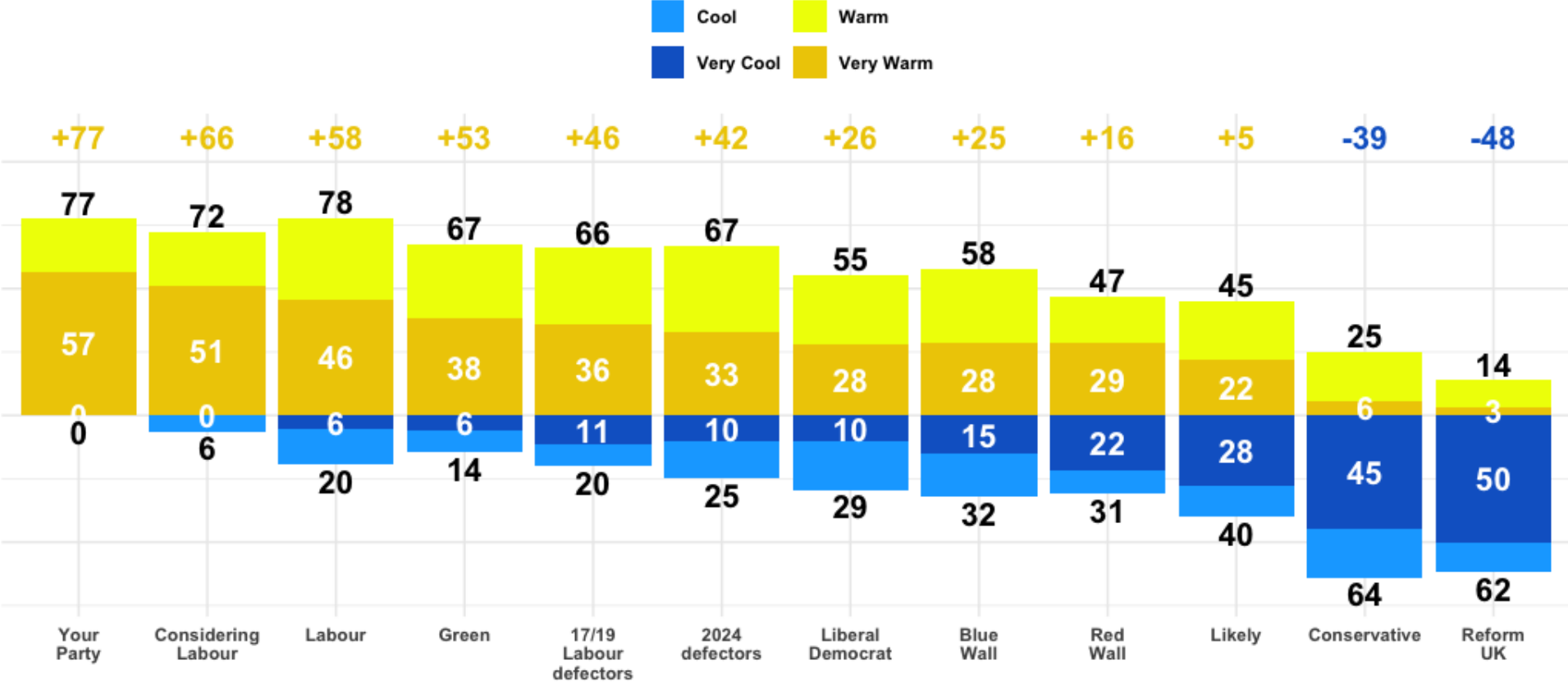


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Labour's ambitious child poverty mission, restoring to 2020 level

The Labour manifesto called for an ambitious strategy to reduce child poverty. The Blair-Brown governments lifted over half a million children out of poverty. But Tory austerity wiped out all the progress and left 4.5 million children in poverty. The rising cost of living has placed pressure on working families. Child Benefit was historically paid to all households to help with costs of raising children, but it has since lost over 20% of its value. Some households no longer receive payments. We should restore the value of Child Benefit to its 2010 levels as part of an ambitious plan to tackle child poverty and the rising cost of living.

Ambitious child poverty strategy gets 45 warm response, an intense response from those considering Labour and Green

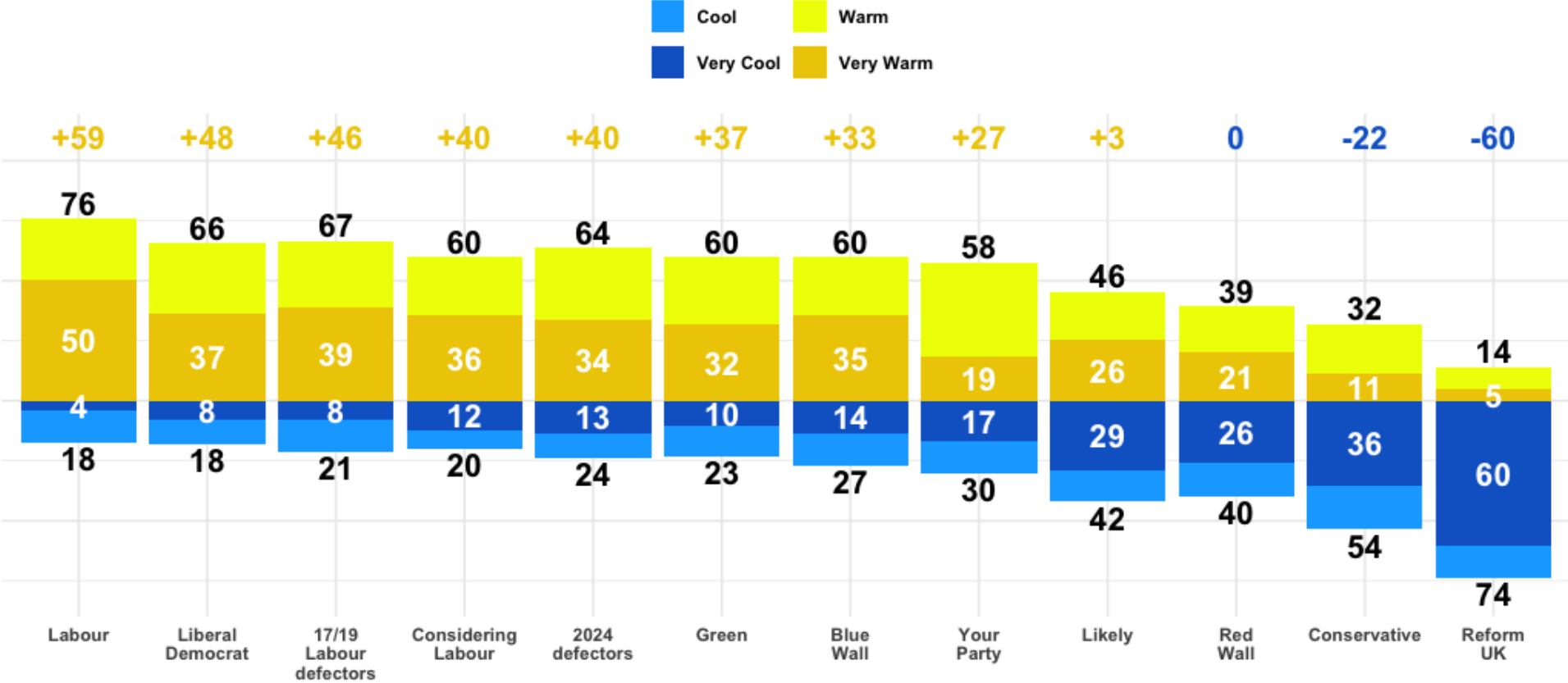


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Labour's "Europe" message text

Aligning with Europe’s Fight for Freedom and Democracy gets 46 Percent Warm Responses

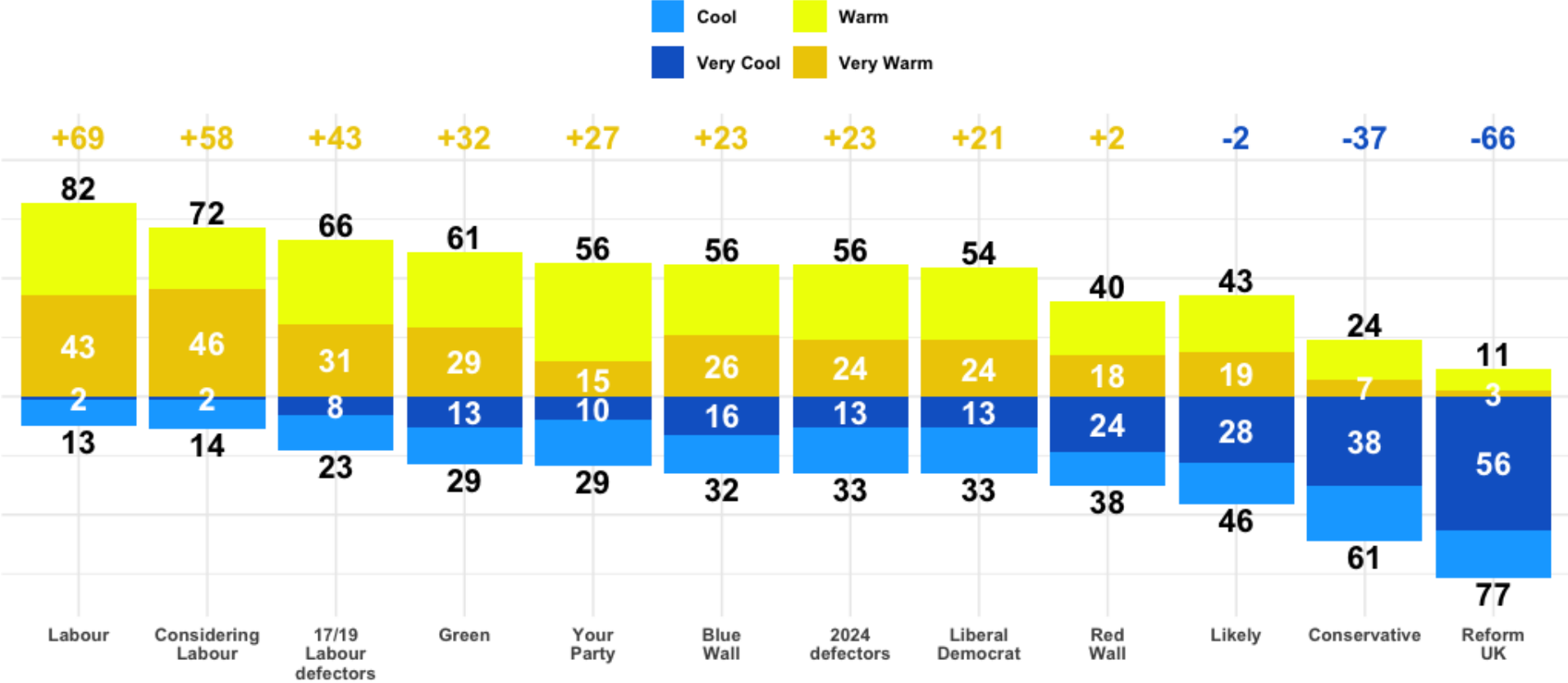


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Labour's message: Britain clean energy superpower, but using natural gas in transition and goal of net zero drives increased investment to get secure and affordable energy

Climate Message gets over 70% for those considering Labour, two-thirds of 17/19 defectors, over 60% of Greens

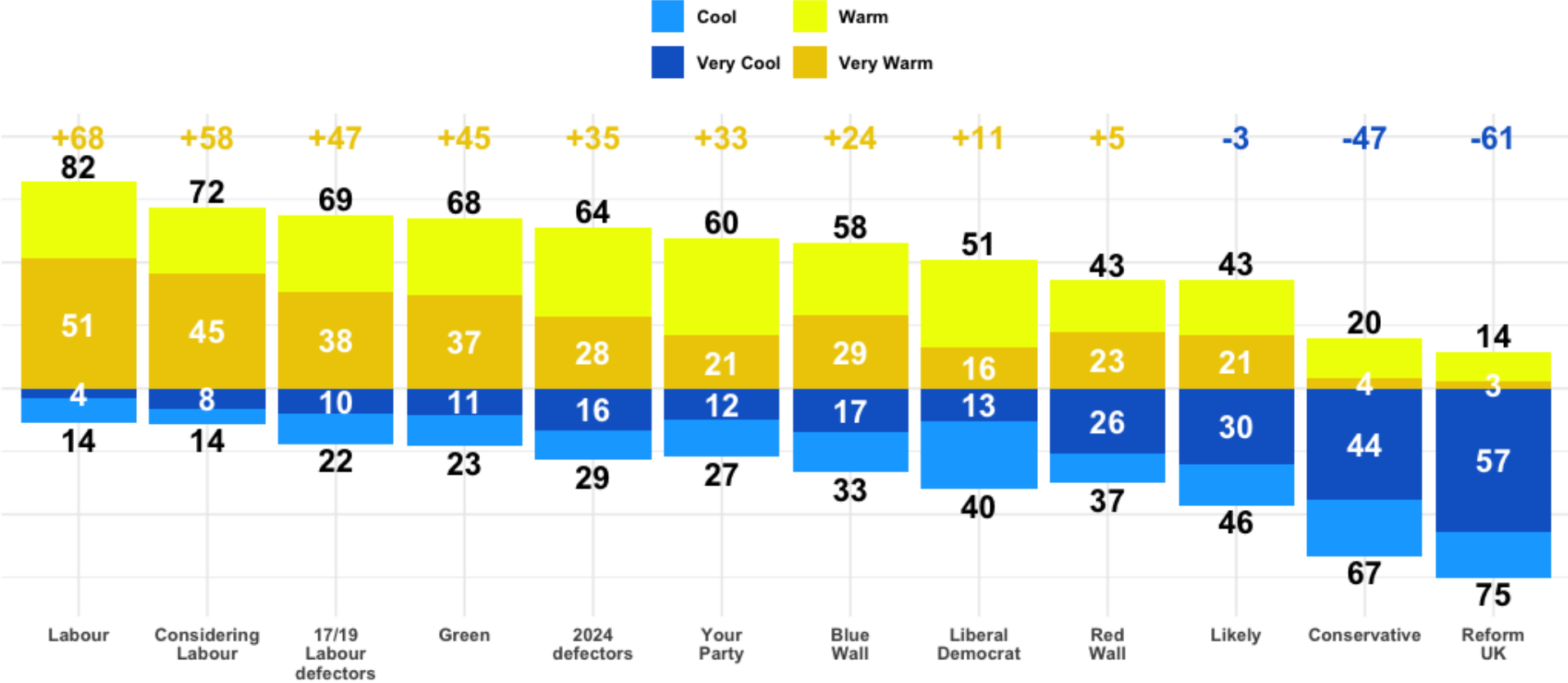


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Getting Britain fairer with new tax policy

Labour must lead on making Britain fairer. We can't be taking away benefits robbed by the Tories under austerity. And we can't keep raising their tax burden during a cost-of-living crisis. Instead, we should raise taxes on the most fortunate to give working people major tax relief. We will reverse the freezing of tax thresholds and cut the National Insurance tax by 2 points to give the working-class long overdue major tax relief. With families facing a cost-of-living crisis, we should raise the Child Benefit by 20% for children and restore the benefit to its level under Labour. Addressing affordability the poor, working, and middle-class families is a Labour missions.

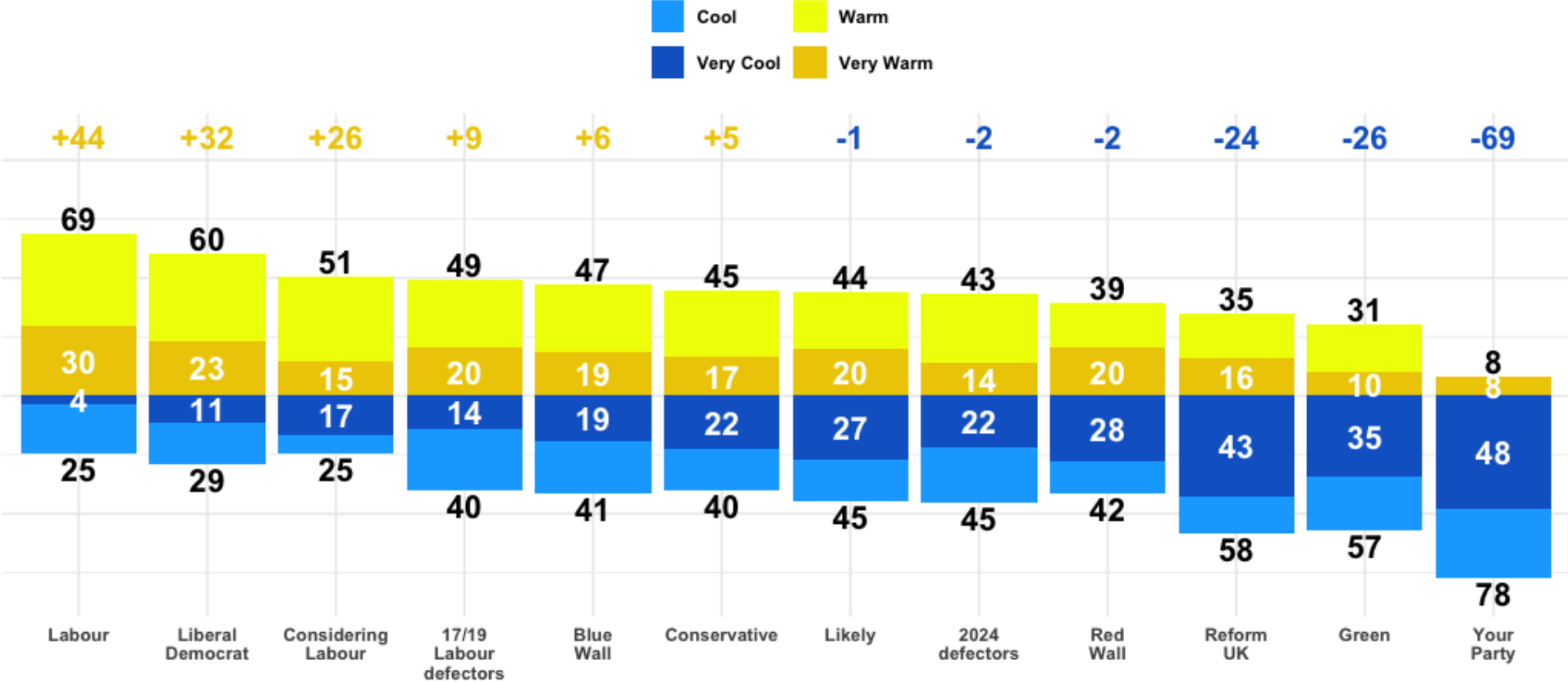


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Labour's immigration message

We know that the government must get a grip of the refugee crisis that has left so many uncomfortable. We are frank about having stricter policies for asylum and work routes. We are requiring longer residency waits for settlement and tougher enforcement for employers and universities. It includes degree requirements for skilled workers, closing care visa, longer waits for permanent residency, and greater fines for employers. Increased number of foreign criminals to be deported. Raised English requirements for dependents seeking citizenship. We are fighting the criminal smuggling gangs here and globally to get our border secure. We are working to end asylum hotels.

Current Labour immigration narrative gets 44 percent warm response, including Liberal Democrats and Defectors

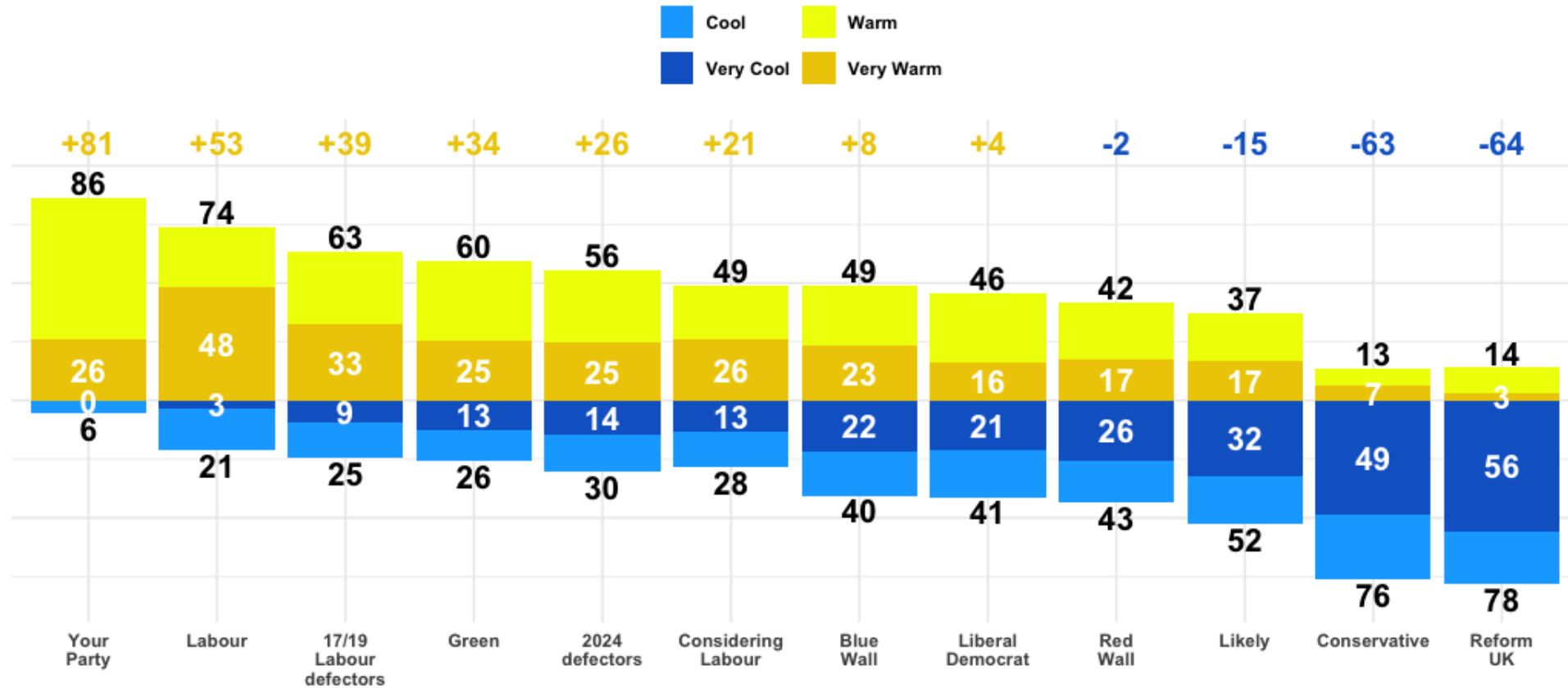


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Restoring child benefit to level in Europe

But Tory austerity wiped out all the progress and left 4.5 million children in poverty. The rising cost of living has placed pressure on working families. Child Benefit was historically paid to all households to help with costs of raising children, but it has since lost over 20% of its value. Some households no longer receive payments. We should restore the Child Benefit to levels found in Europe to around £88 a week. That would cut poverty in half and help all help working families with the cost of living.

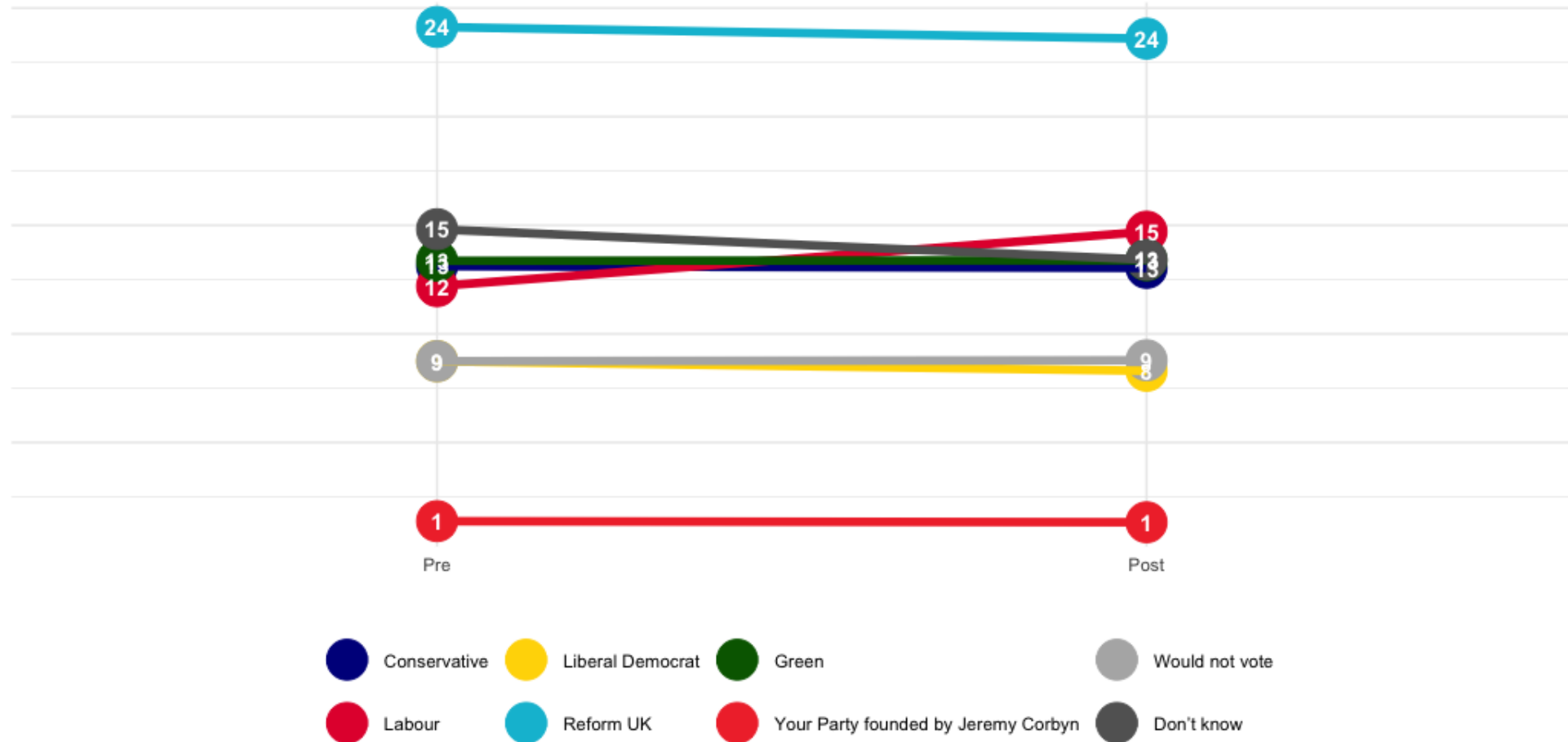
Ambitious child benefit plan gets 37 percent favorable response
